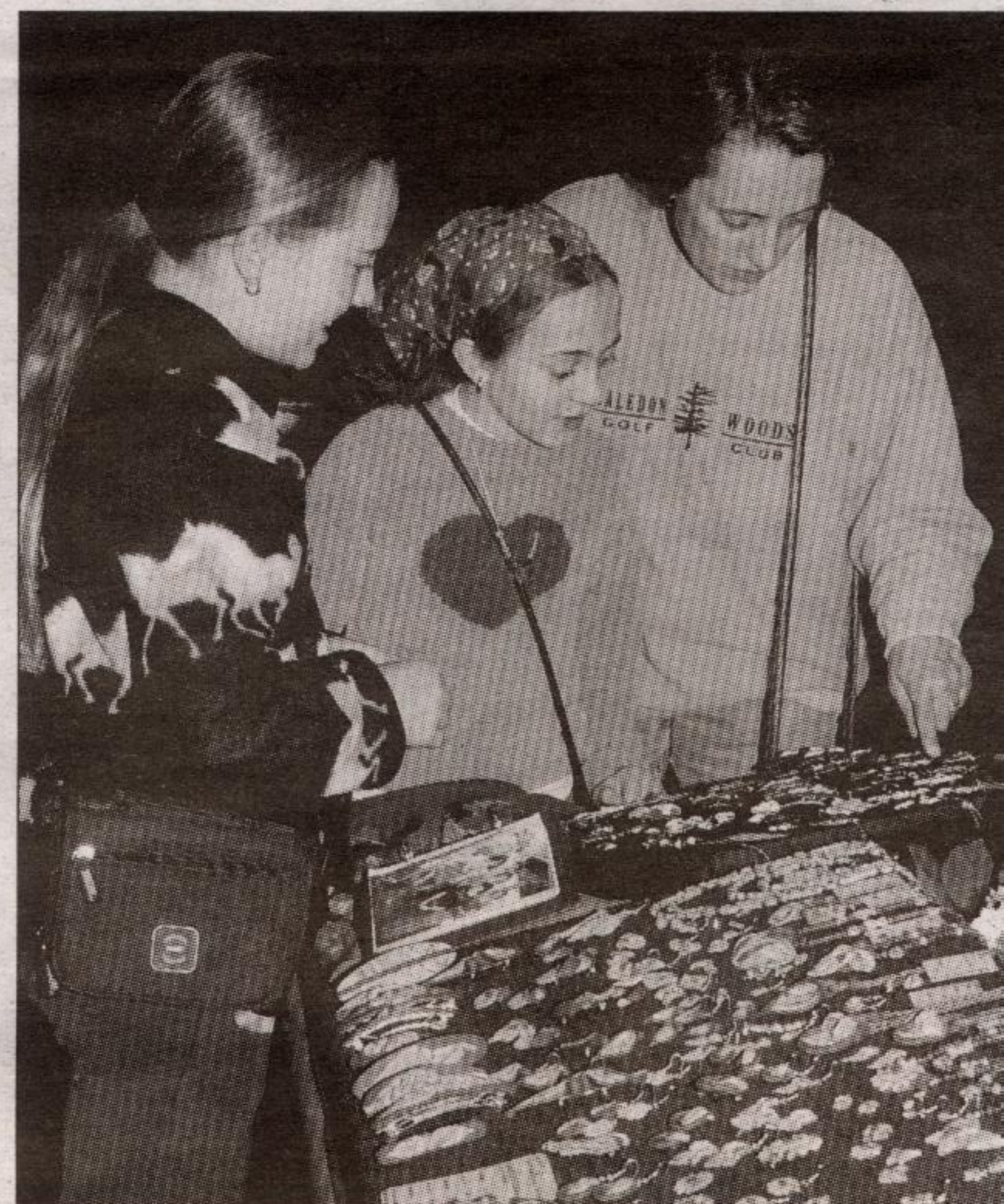

Cemetery space situation is grave

Room at Greenwood and Fairview cemeteries is nearing capacity and Halton Hills council has given immediate approval to build a columbarium for each.

A columbarium is an upright granite unit providing niches (individual spaces) for the interment of cremated remains.

Already 55 of the 64 available niches in the Greenwood Columbarium, built in 2000, are sold with full capacity expected by the spring. Already there are three customers on a waiting list for the second columbarium.

Originally staff requested the Fairview columbarium be considered during the 2005 budget discussions in January, but Acton councillor Jon Hurst wanted to accelerate the timetable.

He motioned that council buys the Acton columbarium now— and his colleagues agreed— saying a need has been demonstrat-

ed through a number of enquiries as well as stated in the town's 2004 Cemetery Business Plan. However, that puts the columbarium reserve into a deficit position. There was only \$60,000 in the reserve, and it will cost about \$70,000 to build the two columbaria.

Town treasurer Ed DeSousa jokingly said he had "no grave concerns" with the council decision.

It's expected sales of the niches at both cemeteries will replenish the reserve— so much so that within 18 months there will be enough to buy another columbarium unit for Greenwood.

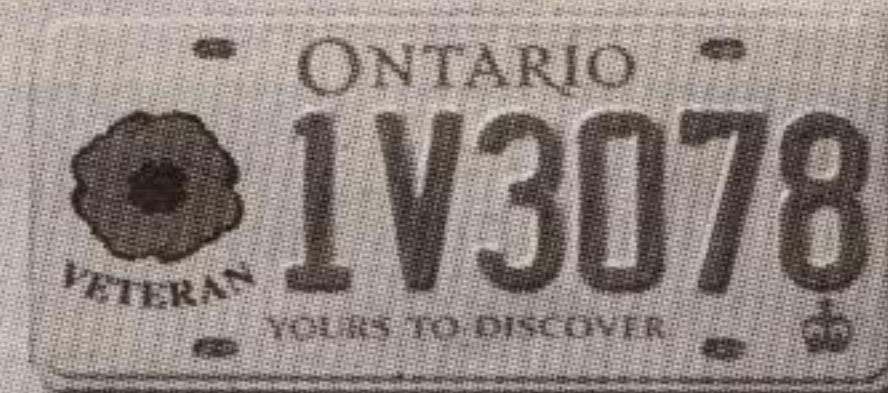
Creative Memorials Ltd. of Milton will build the Greenwood columbarium for about \$30,000. Another \$5,000 will be spent on preparing and landscaping the site. Creative Memorials will be given the order for the Fairview columbarium as well.
