

# Man fined for burning debris

A Halton Hills resident was fined \$3,000 in Milton provincial court Monday for breaking the Town of Halton Hills' bylaw on open-air burning.

Richard Mounsey, of 13422 Highway 7, pleaded guilty to contraventions of the town bylaw which regulates the setting and spreading of fires on agricultural land.

The charges against Mounsey were levied as a result of the fire department's numerous responses to complaints of open burning at his residence.

From April 1999 to July 2004, the Halton Hills Fire Department had responded to repeated incidences, the most recent being July 1, 2004.

On that occasion, it was found that Mounsey had set fire to a large

pile of debris containing household garbage and construction materials. No adequate extinguishers could be found and even though Mounsey had been warned on several occasions, he was not in possession of a valid burn permit.

"Burn permits are free and are issued with strict rules and guidelines attached to ensure any open burning is done in a safe and controlled manner," said fire safety specialist Armando Cabral.

"This conviction should send out a clear message to the community that this type of behaviour will not be tolerated."

The Halton Hills Fire Protection and Prevention Services has issued more than 1,000 burn permits for the current year. All permits expire at year-end.

A Georgetown man has been charged with assault following an altercation Saturday evening.

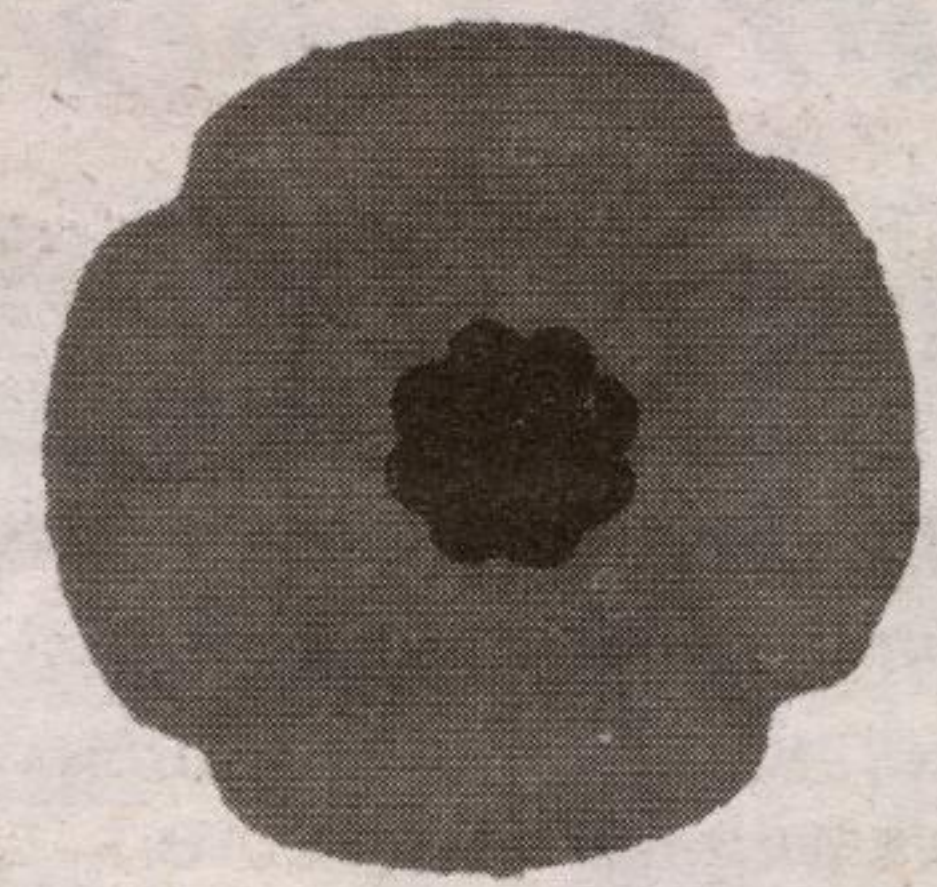
Halton Police said around 7 p.m. an altercation on Joycelyn Cres. ended with the victim being punched in the face and suffering a bruised eye and lacerated lip.
