# Police board names Kingston new deputy chief

The Halton Regional Police Services Board has named a new deputy chief.

The board announced last week that it has selected Michael Kingston as Deputy Chief— Administration. He will commence his new duties Nov. 15.

The Waterdown resident and 28-year veteran of Halton police joins current deputy chief of operations, Gary Crowell, and Chief Ean Algar on the service's toplevel administrative team.

Kingston, 49, is currently a superintendent and commander of No. 1 District, which encompasses Milton, Georgetown and Acton. The creation of the Deputy Chief— Administration position was in response to the Best Practices Study the police services board commissioned to review the efficiency of the administrative functions of the police service.

In a press release, Don Robinson,

Chairman of the Halton Regional Police Services Board, said, "the board was impressed with the skills, experience and commitment of all the candidates, and the service is fortunate to have such a depth of talent."

Kingston, a graduate of Aldershot High

School, started his policing career in Burlington and served as the detective-sergeant for the Criminal Investigations Bureau in Burlington in the mid-1990s.

The police services board said five candidates, all employees of the Halton police service, were interviewed for the new deputy chief's job. Robinson said the board has not yet determined the salary for the new position but that it will be finalized later this month.

# Complaints top 1,000

The Town of Halton Hills' Enforcement Services received 1,027 new complaints in the first half of 2004, resolving 704 cases by the end of September.

There are currently 655 active complaint cases from residents involving everything from noise to property standards. Currently 463 are under investigation, 78 have legal action pending and 114 are awaiting first investigation.
