

At 20th Oldtimers Tournament

Local squads come up short in search for titles

The Georgetown Hockey Heritage Council celebrated its 20th anniversary for the Hockey Heritage Oldtimers Tournament but there was no celebrating for the local squads.

The Sports Unlimited Beavers gave the locals their best chance to claim a championship but The Old Bucks scored with less than three minutes to play in the championship game to take the 45B final 3-2.

Sports Unlimited had two wins and a tie to advance to the championship game. Sports Unlimited blanked the Old Bucks 2-0 to open the tournament and then tied the Erin Ancients 1-1. They secured their spot in the final with a 3-2 win over the Georgetown Hockey Heritage Council Gems.

The Gems didn't fare as well, losing 4-1 to the Old Bucks and 5-3 to the Erin Ancients.

The Halton Hills Grinders reached the 35CD semifinals but were eliminated by the Huronia Hounds.

Mississauga's Last Calls made the most of their goals as they posted a 1-0 victory over the Huronia in the final. John Winstanley scored the winner with 10 minutes to play and the Last Calls recorded their second consecutive shutout.

The Last Calls advanced to the final with a 1-0 win over the Brantford Prairie Wolves while Huronia blanked the Halton Hills Grinders 4-0.

The Grinders posted a 2-1 mark in round-robin play, downing the Toronto Tornados 4-3 and Brantford 3-1 before being edged 1-0 by the Last Calls.

The Meadowvale Warriors were also stingy, blanking the Oakville Old Pistons 3-0 to win the 35E final. Meadowvale clung to a one-goal lead throughout most of the game before scoring twice in the final six minutes.

The Etobicoke Wings scored three times in 49 seconds to down the Oakville Moody Blues 4-2 in the 35F final. Oakville had just taken the lead with 6:22 to play to take a 2-1 lead. But just 79 seconds later, Etobicoke tied the game and 27 seconds later went ahead to stay. The Wings won all three of their round-robin games by one goal.

The Brampton Burnouts built a 4-0 lead and then held off a comeback by the Erin Old Masters in the final 10 minutes to

win 5-3.

The Brampton Falcons rolled over the Waterloo Wackers 8-1 to claim the 50B championship. Waterloo had edged Brampton 4-3 in round-robin play.

The Kitchener-Waterloo Dutchmen survived a semifinal shootout to advance to the final. There the Dutchmen scored twice in the last 10 minutes to down the Snap Shots 3-1 in the 50D final. The Dutchmen were undefeated in the tournament with a 4-0-1 record.

Senior Rebels rally to nip Holy Trinity for spot in final

in command at 20-13. The Rebels rallied and closed the gap to two points but just didn't have enough points to play with to make up the difference.

The Rebels hurt their comeback bid with uncharacteristic service mistakes.

"The ironic thing was that we spent our last practice working on our serves," said Kaciulis said.

Georgetown didn't immediately capitalize on its momentum from the game two comeback as Holy Trinity took a 5-3 lead. After tying the game, the Rebels season was down to a nine-point game to stay alive.

"It's sports," Kaciulis said. "You know there can be upsets. They were playing a good game and we had some bad moments but we also had some great moments at the end."

The Rebels began driving the ball past the Titan blockers, who had been very effective throughout the game. Georgetown took six of seven points for a 9-6 lead.

Holy Trinity momentarily regrouped after a timeout to pull within one but the Rebels again showed the play that has made them the fourth ranked team in the province and again took six of the next seven points to put the match away.

The Rebels will meet another undefeated team, their rivals Oakville-Trafalgar, in the Halton final Friday at Sheridan College in Oakville at 3:30 p.m.

Oakville-Trafalgar also needed three games to edge Acton and deny an all-Halton Hills final (see story page 20).
