# Bar worker assaulted

Milton man is facing charges after police were called to Nashville North Saturday night.

Halton Police report while a man was being escorted from the bar by an employee for disruptive behaviour he became aggressive and struck the employee twice in the face.

Police arrested the man and found he had a quantity of hashish on him.

Charged with assault, possession of a controlled substance, and two counts of breach of undertaking is Trevor Snow, 32, of Five Sideroad.

Halton Police are investigating a break and enter into a Nassagewaya Town Line Rd. home that occurred last Wednesday.

Taken were a Sony 32" television, Sony receiver, Minolta camera, Sony DVD player, JVC DVD player Nintendo Game Cube and Toshiba laptop computer. Also taken were 10 endocet tablets and 40 oxycontin tablets.

Police recommend if anyone finds the pills to turn them into police. Entry was gained into the home through an unlocked front door.

# Business owner fined

A Halton Hills business owner was fined \$1,000 in Milton court recently for improper storage of combustibles.

A spokesperson for Halton Hills Fire Protection and Prevention Services said Mohammad A. Qureshi of Ash's Auto Sales pleaded guilty to contravening the Fire Protection and Prevention Act in court last Monday.

The spokesperson said the charges were related to the storage of combustibles at his business between April 2003 and July 2004. The spokesperson said the storage of the items was a fire hazard, and in contravention of the Fire Protection and Prevention Act, and Qureshi did not correct the matter.

"This was basically a housekeeping issue," said Chief of Prevention and Public Education, John Martin. "The risk was real and would have definitely impacted fire suppression activities."

The inappropriate storage of combustibles increases the potential of a fire occurring and the increased fuel load results in larger, hotter more dangerous fires, he said.
