Rebels bounced

Their season might be over but the Georgetown Rebels junior girls basketball team provided plenty of thrills on their way out.

Trish Gauthier's basket with three seconds to play forced overtime but the Rebels couldn't capitalize on their second chance as they fell 46-38 to the T.A. Blakelock Tigers in Thursday's Halton junior girls playoff game.

"It's a tough way to end the season but they played their hearts out," said Rebel coach Manny Saitis.

Georgetown took the lead midway through the opening quarter and never trailed until Blakelock scored with 28 seconds to play in regulation to take a 35-34 lead. With the Tigers up 36-34 and 10 seconds remaining, the Rebels missed a game-tying layup. However, the rebound went off a Tiger player, giving Georgetown possession. Another attempt at the tying basket missed but Gauthier put away the rebound to send the game to overtime.

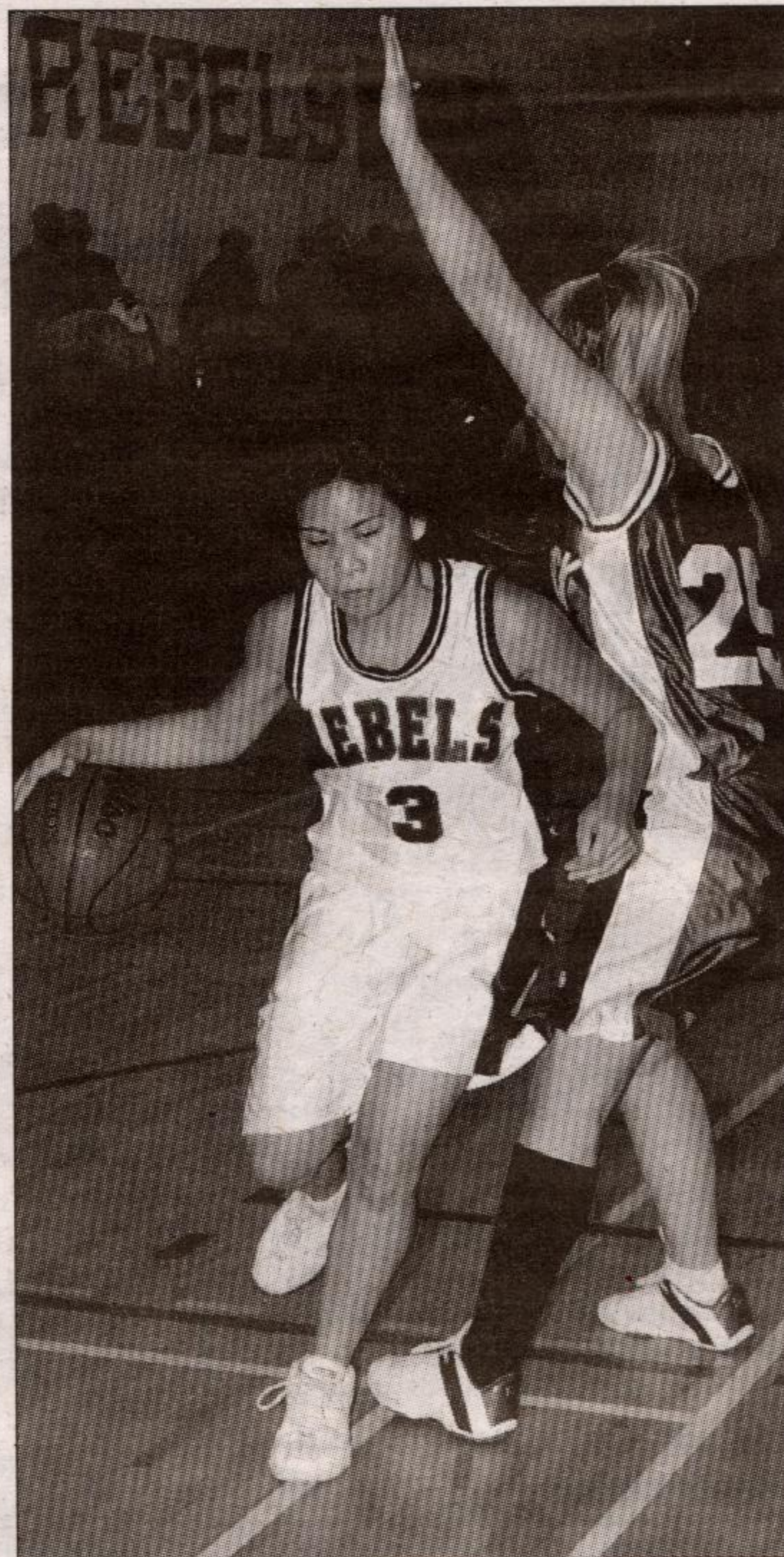
The Rebels, who were held to just 15 points in their final game of the regular season, stormed out of the gate to score 14 in the opening quarter to take a 14-10 lead. The Tigers narrowed the lead to 22-21 at the half but the Rebels rebuilt their advantage to as much as six during the third quarter.

Ruth Tupe led the Rebels with 11 points, Gauthier had eight and Meghan Shantz added six.

"They've shown a lot of improvement over the year," Saitis said. "It's a very young and inexperienced team but they've done a great job."

Saitis will be able to continue to build on that improvement next season. With just three players moving up to senior, he'll have most of his team back next year.
