
Halton Hills Community Support and Information (HHCSI) will be hosting a Charity Bonspiel on Saturday, Dec. 4 at North Halton Golf Club.

team), you will curl two 8-end games, enjoy coffee and muffins prior to curling, as well as lunch and dinner at North Halton Golf and Country Club.


