Globe brings Hollywood to Georgetown

A good detective story and that is what you will get with Georgetown Globe Production's next show, City of Angels.

Filled with humor, satire and terrific music, City of Angels tells the story of a 1940s novelist who turns his private-eye story into a Hollywood screen play. Stine, the novelist, (performed by Pat McManus) has his hands full dealing with the overbearing movie producer (played by Doug Feggans). Meanwhile, Stine's wife Gabby (portrayed by Sonia Kats) disapproves of his loss of principles as he succumbs to the sleazy Hollywood world.

As Stine's detective story unfolds, with the help of his wife and alter-ego Stone, he eventually comes to terms with his own conscience and the result is a Hollywood happy ending.

City of Angels is filled with a number of other lively and colourful characters, portrayed by some of Globe's best performers. In addition, a harmonious jazz quintet assists in telling the story.

As added twist to the plot, look for cameos by some of Halton Hills' local personalities. The audience can play detective too by spotting the celebrities.

City of Angels, the 1990 Tony Award Best Musical, is packed with fast paced adult comedy, smart one-liners and a fantastically energetic jazz score.
