Choices and risks

AHS students learn about CHAT

THAT (Communities and Hospitals Against Trauma) came to Acton — High School to show the Grade 11s the product of unsafe choices and how to lower the risks. The hourlong presentation's main focus was on drinking and driving.

"Ninety per cent of accidents are both preventable and predictable."

"It is your choice to get into a car with an impaired driver."

These two true statements were made by Constable Kate Pulford. Her speech on choice and decision-making rang clearly throughout the hall. She was followed by a slideshow, showing the results of bad decision-making. It was a very moving, albeit graphic, depiction of real-life trauma set to music.

Paramedic Bill Kennedy gave a talk about always wearing your seatbelt, because in the end, it could wind up being the very thing your life depends on.

Alison Goertzen, for the Red Cross, had an interesting talk on the first 0.7 seconds of a car crash. The thought that things can happen that fast gives a quick reminder to think about your actions beforehand.

Another paramedic was Pauline Smith, who addressed the students about making safe choices, and wearing the proper gear for high risk activities. She made five strong points: Think; Drive Sober; Look First; Buckle Up; Get Trained; and Wear the Gear.

Speaking on behalf of the nurses was Joleen Hammond. She gave her view of what happens to trauma patients when they come to the hospital. Her descriptive look at some of the equipment used made you give second thought to a lot of things.

The final speaker was Leslie Wells, an incredible young woman who has accomplished a great amount despite the odds against her. One night, while drinking, she was thrown into the shallow end of a pool where she broke her neck. Even though she was pronounced a quadriplegic, she

regained some of the use of her arms and hands. She talked to the students about making safe decisions for yourself, and looking out for the well being of others.

All in all, it was a very memorable visit, and was well received by both teachers and students. I hope that the presentation gave the students better foresight of what might happen and help them to make safer decisions.


