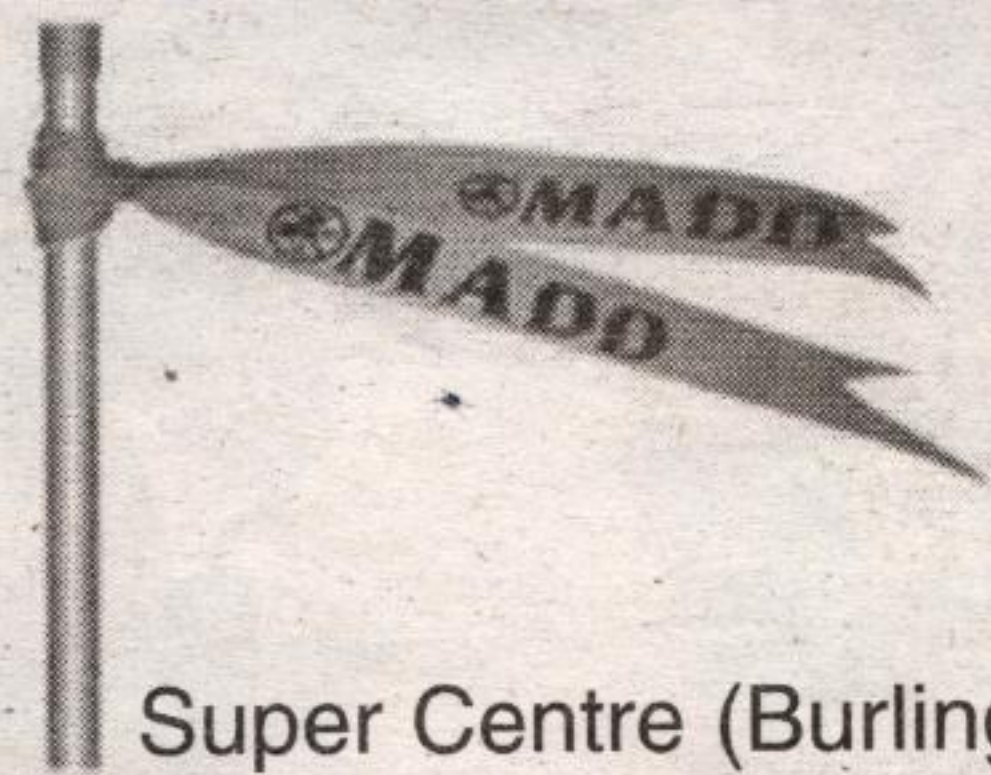

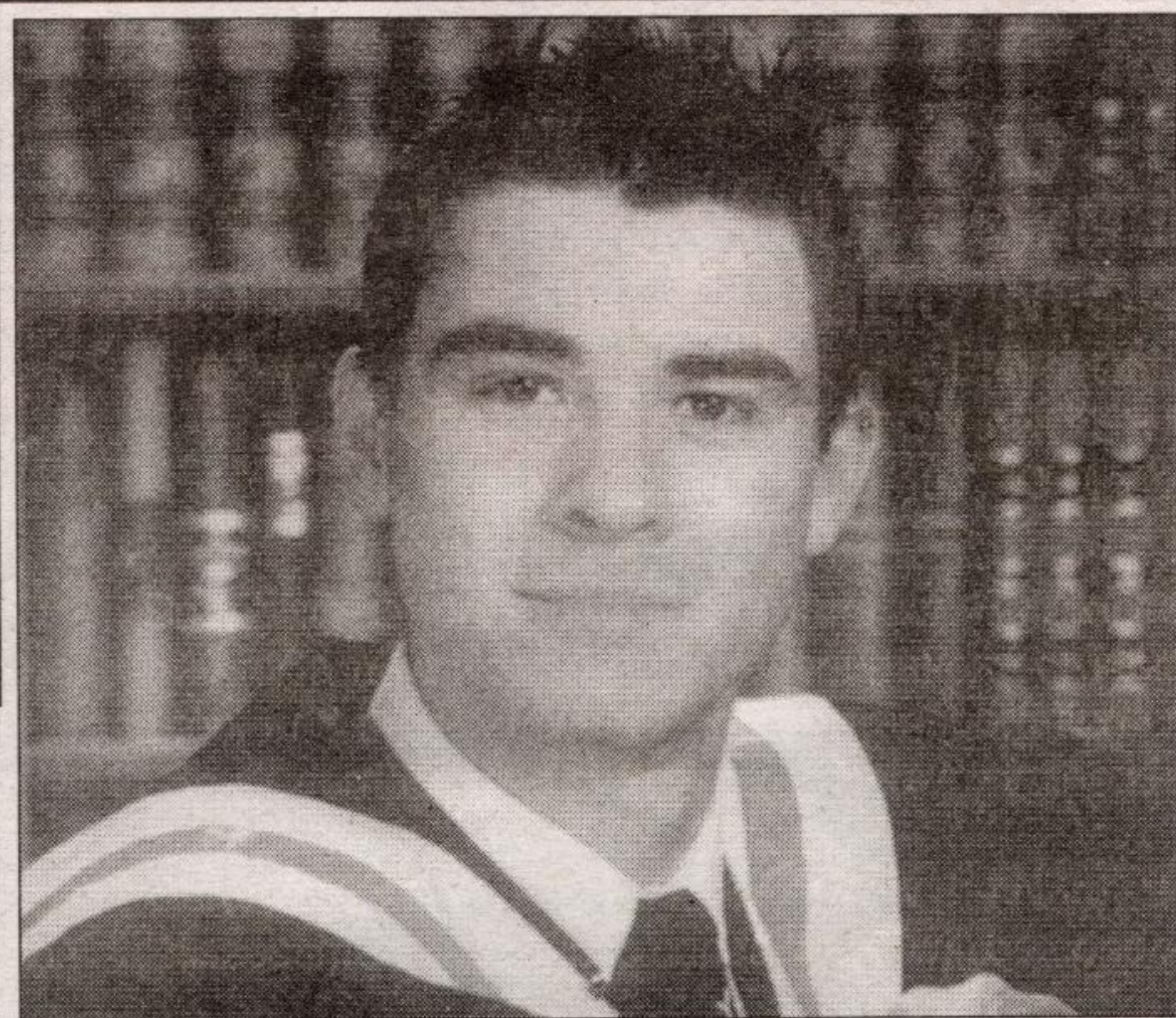

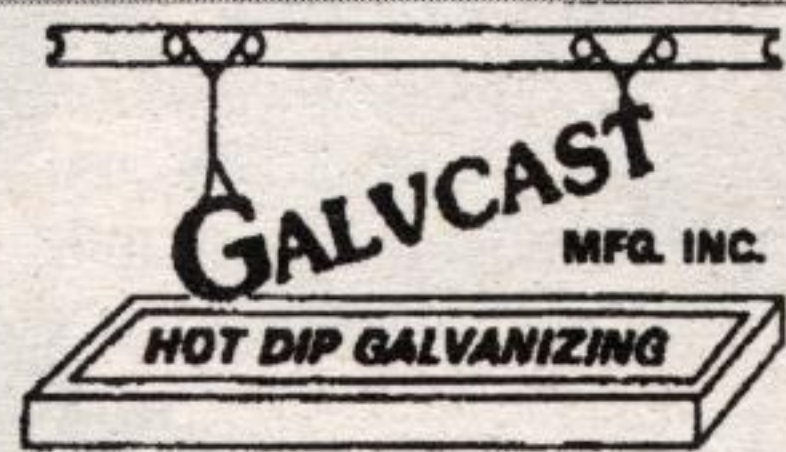
A mother's tribute to her only son killed by a drunk driver on July 28, 2003

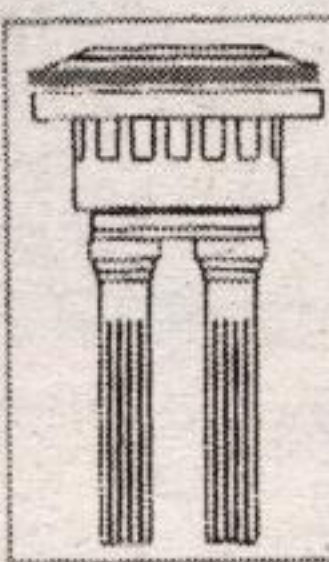

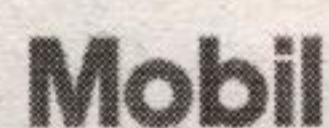
