








But it's not as if Sweazey hasn't been productive. Between goals he racked up 17 assists and leads the team with 31 points. Still, it felt good to finally find the mesh, especially coming off a 3-1 loss to Oakville where the Raiders couldn't score despite many good opportunities.

"We talked about the scoring opportunities in the Oakville game," Sweazey said, "and basically it just comes down to lack of concentration. (The coaches) just want us to make sure when we have scoring chances that we make them count, that we're not just closing our eyes and firing it at the net."

Frieday, who was celebrating his first Jr. A hat-trick,

also got the coaching staff's message.

"We had a lot of chances against Oakville— open nets, guys wide open. They just told us you're only going to get a couple of scoring chances a game, so if you get in the slot, shoot for the corners instead of firing it into the goalie's chest."

Frieday said he tried not to think about the hat-trick too much but the thought did cross his mind as he went into the final period with two goals. Despite leading the team in goals with 15, there haven't been many hat-trick opportunities for Frieday. In that regard, he's been a victim of his own consistency. He's scored, in 12 of the Raiders' 25 games but only had one other multiple-goal game heading into Tuesday.

Frieday said the team wanted a strong showing following Saturday's loss.

"When you come off a loss you want to show what you can do," Frieday said.

The Raiders have had no problem with that this year. They've outscored their opponents 32-5 in their four games following a loss.
