

The True North Brass made its debut in 1997 and has since solidified its reputation as one of Canada's most exciting ensembles. Proudly Canadian in focus and expression, True North Brass has been welcomed not only in Canada but also in China and throughout North America. The group's first three CD recordings, on the Opening Day Label, have received enthusiastic press reaction. The ensemble has also been a featured guest at the International Brass Symposium, chosen from the elite of the international brass world. They continue to tour and perform across North America.
