"It's the first time a community garden has ever entered the competition, so we were very, very pleased with our results," says Diana Pooke, head of the Lucy Maud Montgomery




The heritage seed will be available at Canoe Country located at 16 Adamson Street North in Norval this Saturday between 11 a.m. and 4
