Band shell is centennial project

o celebrate Rotary International's centennial year Acton Rotary Club plans to build an open-air band shell in Prospect Park.

Plans for the band shell were presented recently at the club's annual Gala Dinner and Auction.

He said the project is subject to approval from the Town of Halton Hills, but they are hoping to begin construction this summer.

When asked about the cost of the project, he said it was currently out to tender.

Plans and a scale model have been completed (see below) and will be available for the public to view at a location to be decided.

"It's meant to enliven and create some vitality in Prospect Park," said Beaton.

The building will be used largely for musical events, but the club also envisions other uses.

"How many small towns can boast a beautiful lake within walking distance of most residential areas?" said Beaton. "So, we have the park, we have the lake, and we know that we have many longtime and new families looking for some weekend fun."

Acton Rotary Club president Herb Dodds said when there was a need in the community, the club has responded whenever able.

"Rotary believes in the renewal, revitalization, and long-term vision of a Prospect Park that will again invite all Actonians to enjoy family and friends together. This will be a first step toward that goal."


