

Suspect sought after man stabbed repeatedly with beer bottle

Talton Police are looking for a man after a 27-year-old LGeorgetown man was stabbed with a broken beer bottle early Sunday.

Halton Police report the incident occurred at approximately 2:50 a.m. in the lobby of a Park Ave. apartment building. The victim and other men were involved in a verbal dispute that led to an altercation.

Police report the victim was stabbed in the head, neck and shoulder area with a broken beer bottle, then the suspect and other men got on the elevator and left.

The victim was taken to hospital with non-life threatening injuries where he received stitches to his neck and

above his left eye.

The suspect is described as a white male, approximately 23 years old, 6'2", 200 lbs, with short brown hair, shaved close. He was wearing a hat to the side and a blue long-sleeved shirt and jeans. He was with three other skinny males, believed to be younger.

A Mississauga man was charged with impaired driving and having over 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood after police


stopped a vehicle on Trafalgar Rd. north of Five Sideroad early Friday morning.

Police report someone attempted to break into a 22 Sideroad home Monday afternoon.


