

Crazy Outhouse Race set for May 28

More than a dozen teams are expected to be pushing their outhouses down Main St. next Saturday (May 28)— all vying for the championship in the Third Annual Crazy Outhouse Race.

All money raised in the event will go to Cancer Assistance Services of Halton Hills.

The event will kick off at 8:30 a.m. Saturday with a pancake breakfast courtesy of the Georgetown Lion's Club and McGibbon Hotel.

At 9 a.m. the judging of the outhouses will begin, followed by the Outhouse Parade at 9:30 a.m. The Celebrity Toilet Paper Toss will start at 10 a.m. and the Outhouse Race is set to begin at 10:30 a.m.

Other events scheduled throughout the event include a toilet paper fashion show, treasure hunt, Tooney in the Toilet Toss, Tic Tac Toilet Game, face painting, Flushing Pond (fishing pond), and a baked bean lunch at McGibbon Hotel at approximately noon.

Celebrities expected to attend include Jeff Lumby, (Winston Rothschild III of The Red Green Show), country music recording artist Alysha Brooke, Tom Reynolds of The Weather Channel, who will serve as emcee of the event, Halton Hills Mayor Rick

Bonnette, and Wellington-Halton Hills MP Michael Chong.

Area children are encouraged to decorate their bikes, trikes, doll carriages, scooters, wagons and go-carts with toilet paper and take part in the Crazy Outhouse Parade. Kids who only have roller blades or skate boards are encouraged to decorate themselves.

Anyone interested in participating in the parade should be outside Georgetown Library by 9 a.m. Helmets must be worn during the parade, and a responsible adult should come along to provide permission to participate.

Outhouses must be built according to the rules and guidelines set out, and teams are encouraged to get creative, get in costume, and have fun.

Prizes will be awarded to the first and second place winners, for most original outhouse. Consolation prizes will also be awarded.

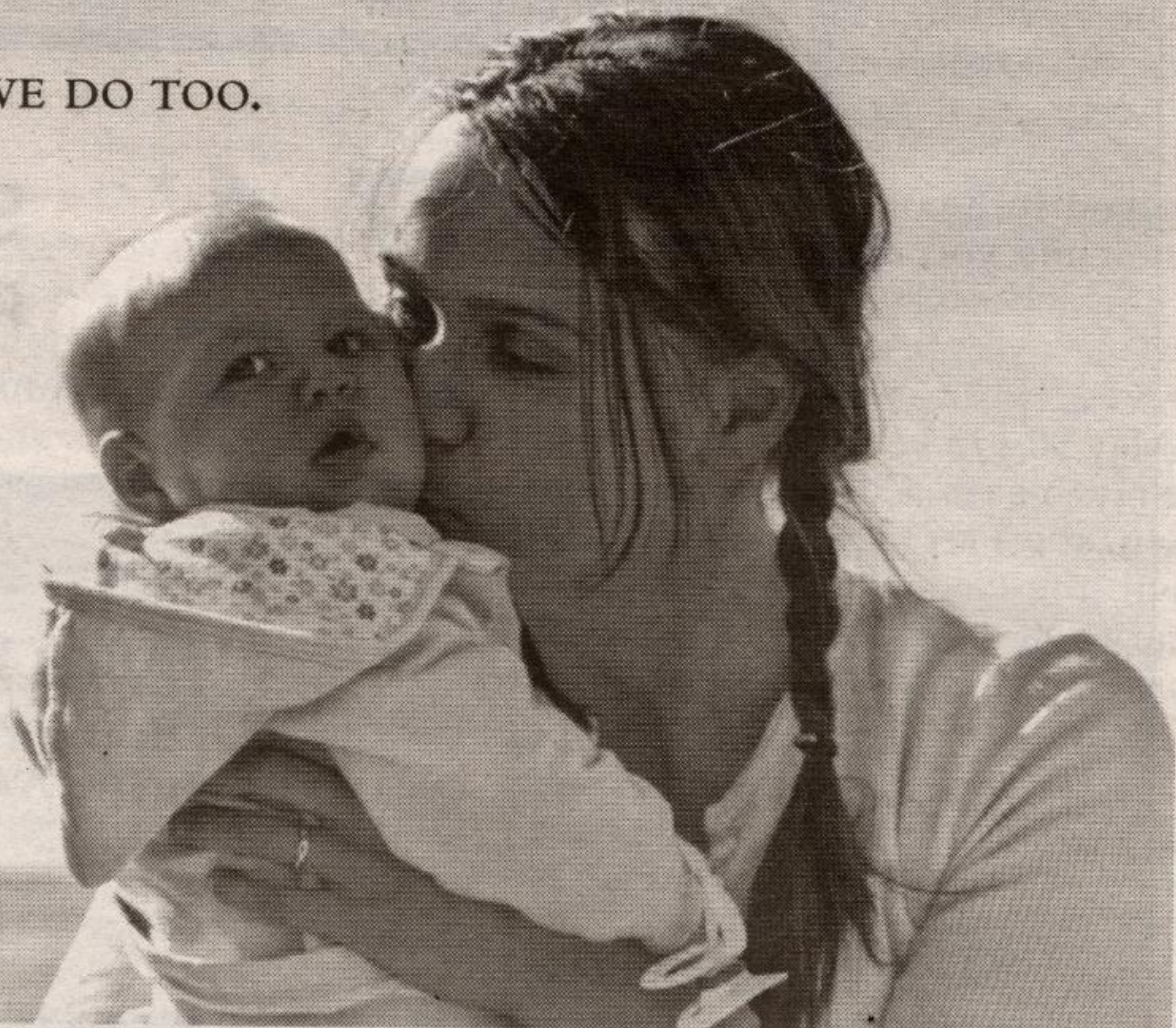
Participant teams are encouraged to solicit sponsorship for their entries.
