Minor Bantam Eagles dump Mississauga for seventh COBA title

The Georgetown Sundown Integrated Systems Minor Bantam Eagles downed Mississauga 11-6 to win their seventh straight Central Ontario Baseball Association title.

The victory earns Georgetown a place in this weekend's provincial championship tournament in Windsor where they will try to win their second Ontario Baseball Association title in the last four years.

The Eagles got strong pitching performances to win three straight games at the COBA championship. Brad Dilks, Jacob Krane and William Cook allowed 13 runs, only nine of them earned, while combining to strike out 18 batters.

Dilks pitched a complete game as the Eagles opened the tournament with an 8-5 win over Mississauga. Krane followed with another complete game in a 12-2 victory over Waterdown. Georgetown met Mississauga again in the final and this time William Cook threw a complete game to clinch the title.

At the plate, the Eagles used to timely hitting to score 31 runs. Adam Slade and Tyler Wilson each had a double and a triple. Krane, Kyle Hansen and Luke Chenell each had a double.

GreenCart Demonstration Program



What: The GreenCart is like a Blue Box for your kitchen scraps. Kitchen scraps (including meat and bones), paper towels, coffee grounds and more will now be collected at the curb in the GreenCart, instead of in a regular garbage bag.

Who: Five neighbourhoods across Halton Region are participating in the GreenCart demonstration program.

** GreenCart collection will occur every week on the same day as your regular garbage collection.

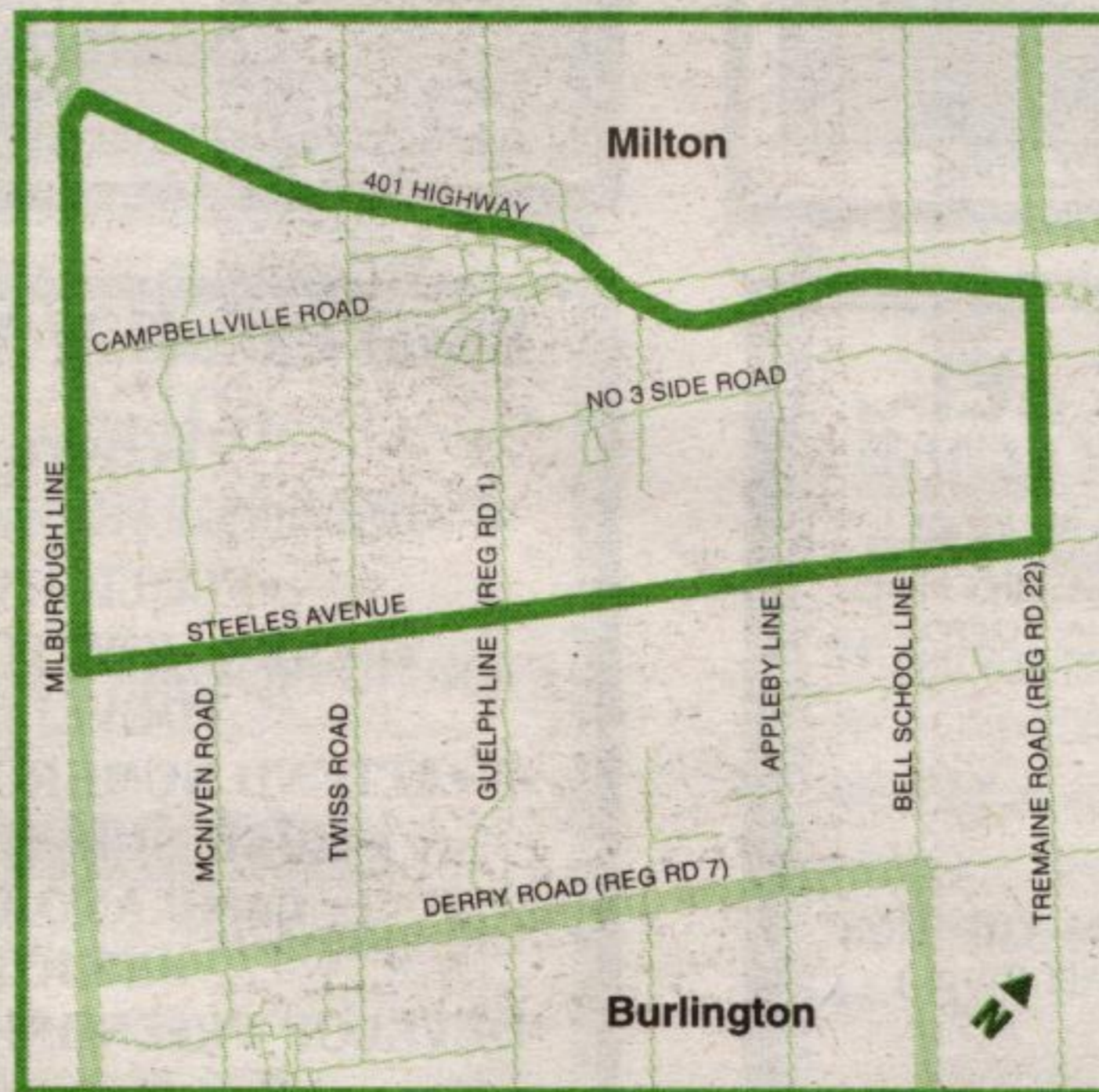

The demonstration program will be evaluated during the first year of collection and processing, and will help us to develop the GreenCart program for the entire Region.

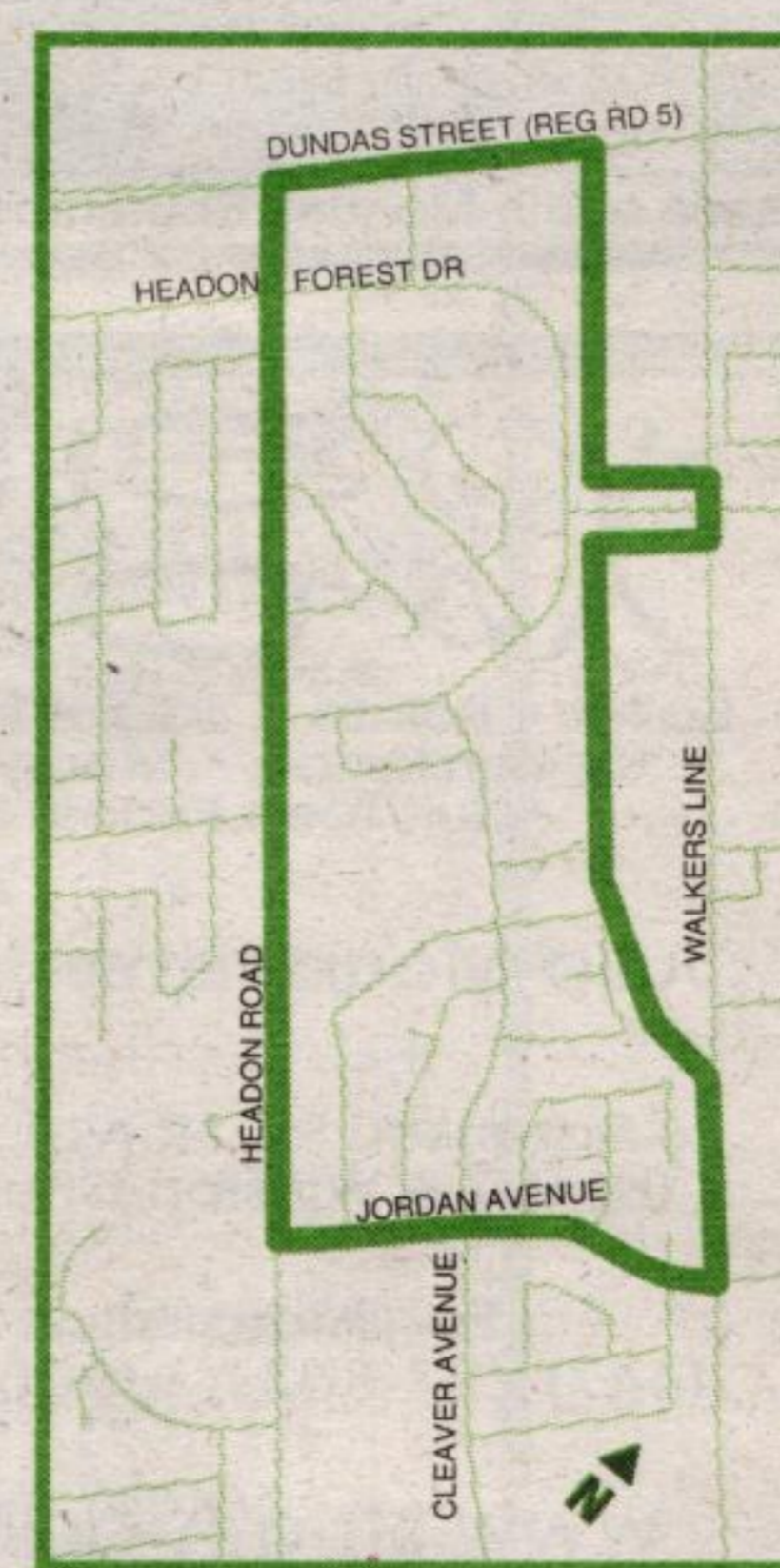
Why: Around 45% of the average garbage bag in Halton is made up of food scraps and other organic material that could be turned into compost. We need to get this material out of the garbage to help extend the lifespan of our landfill, so it can keep working for Halton residents for years to come.

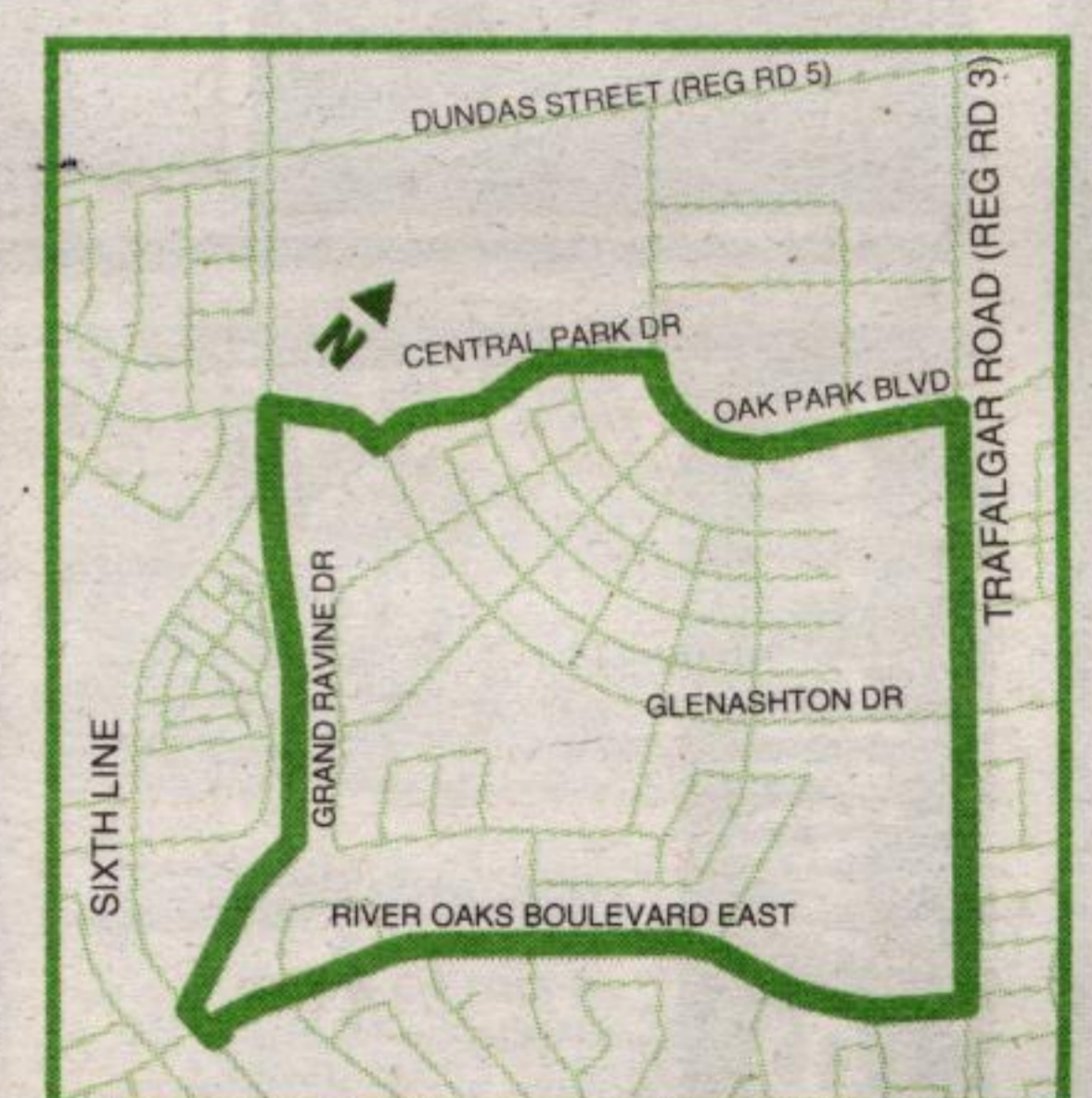

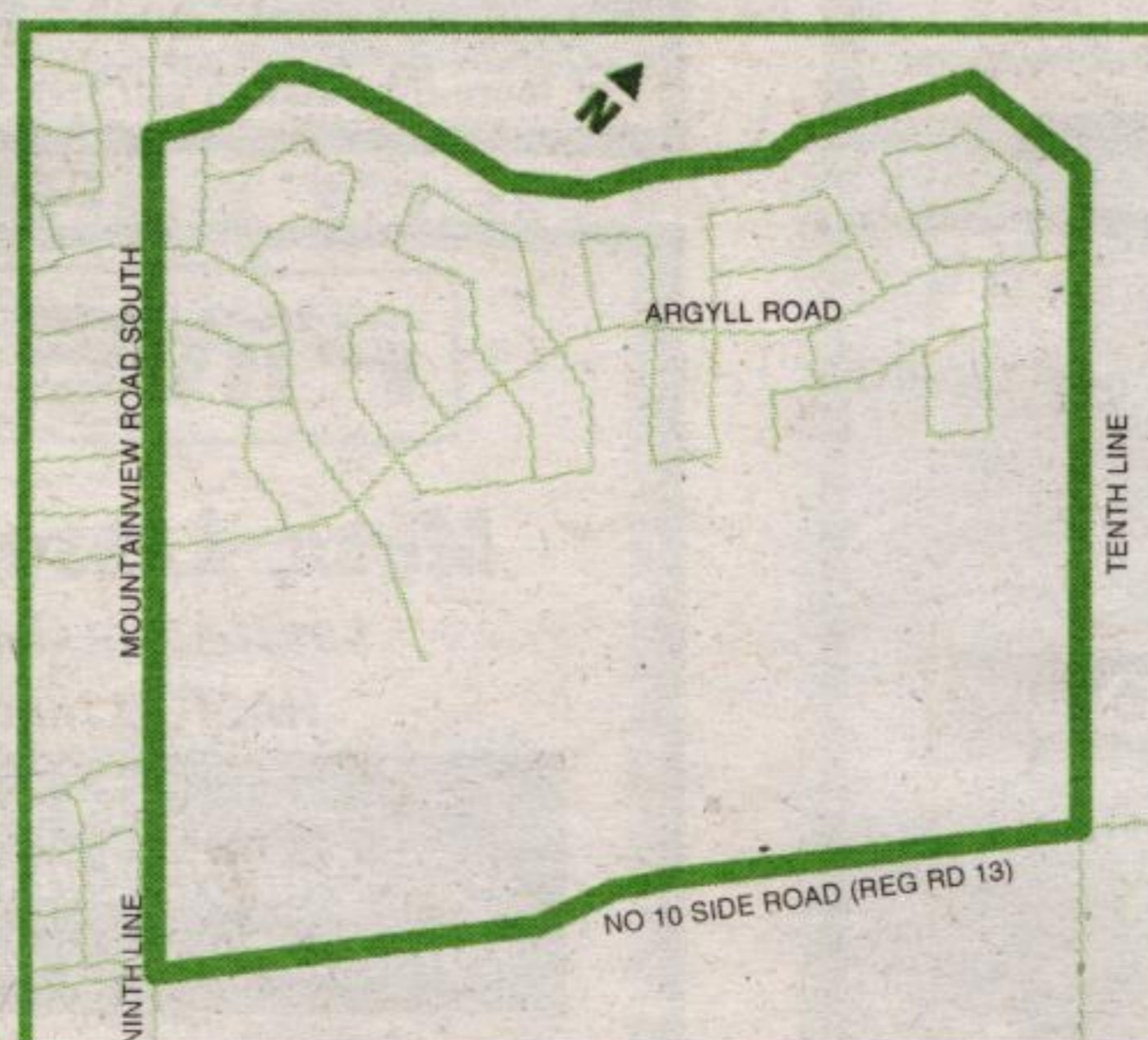
Rural Milton Tuesday



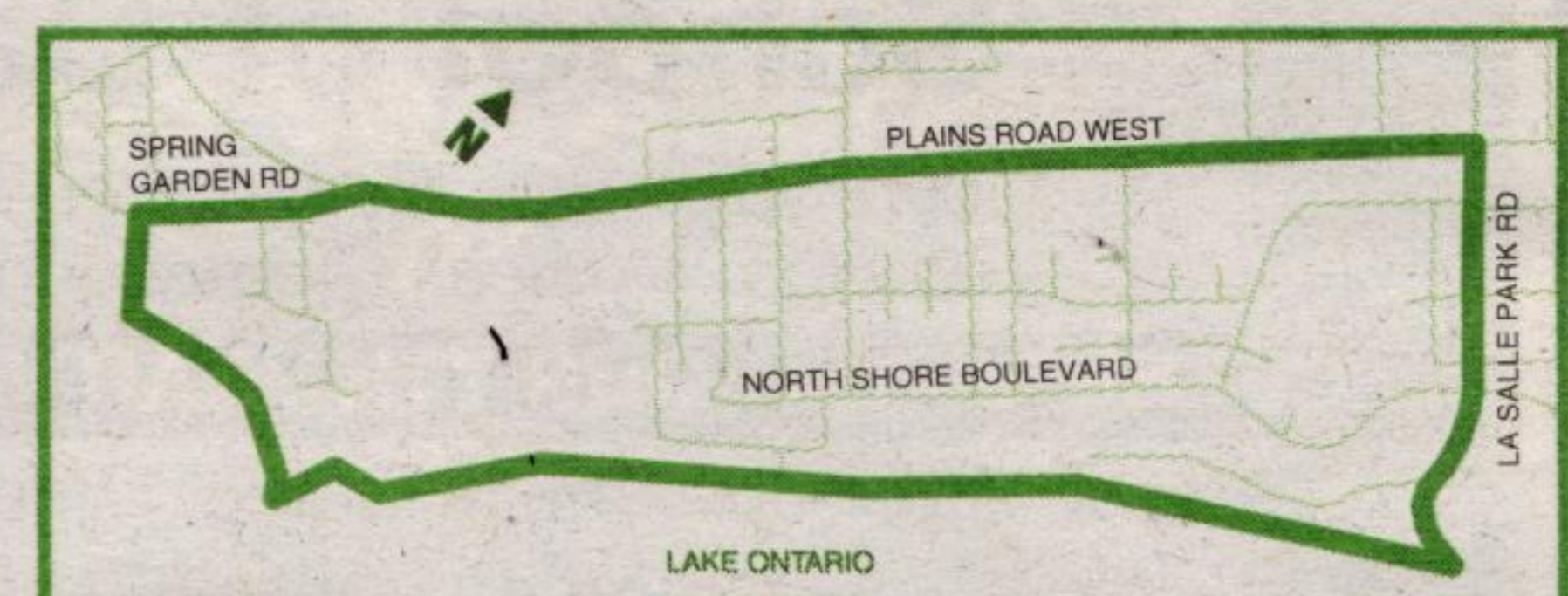
