## Education Day kicks off Acton Fall Fair Friday

The three-day fair, billed as "The Best Little Fair in Ontario" will be held in Prospect Park, from Friday to Sunday, Sept. 18.

The Acton Fall Fair Parade gets under way at noon as does the Halton 4-H Pony Mounted Games.



The afternoon entertainment includes: 4X4 Truck Pull, Antique Tractor Pull, pet show and the Pedal Tractor Pull.

Admission prices are \$7 for adults, youths (13-17) and seniors, \$3 for children (5-12) and free for children under age 5. A weekend pass costs \$15. Parking is available for \$5.


