Photographers alert: Shooting scheduled next week for Capture the Hills 2005

Once again, local amateur photographers will be dusting off their photo gear in preparation of the annual Capture the Hills 2005, a two-day photo contest sponsored by Halton Hills Camera Club.

This year, the contest is limited to 100 non-professional photographers. Last year, the competition was sold out, so organizers are suggesting people register in advance.

Held Saturday, Sept. 24 and Sunday, Sept. 25, the two-day photography competition will see amateur photographers combing Halton Hills area, capturing many images that catch the eye on film.

Contest Image Categories will be: 1. People, Creatures and Critters, 2. Scenery and Architecture, and 3. Foliage and Flowers.

There will also be two junior categories, one for ages 8 and under, the other for ages 9 to 14.

Entry fee is \$25, which includes one roll of ISO 200 (24 exposure film) and processing. For the junior categories, open to persons 14 and under, the entry fee is only \$10, and parental consent is required.

All shooting must be done between 6:30 a.m. September 24, and 10 p.m. on September 25. The registration deadline is noon, September 24.

After the competitor is finished shooting the film, it is dropped off at Halton Camera

Exchange, at 130 Guelph Street, Georgetown, before 10 p.m. on September 25.

All pictures must be taken on the film provided and within the competition boundaries of Halton Hills. A map will be provided.

Competitors pick up their processed prints September 30 or October 1, and have until October 7 to choose their favorites to be entered in the competition. A maximum of six prints (two per category) can be entered for judging.

Valuable prizes will be awarded for first, second and third place winners in each category as determined by a panel of local judges. Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette will also select an image for the special honour of the "Mayor's Choice Award".

Winning photos will be unveiled and prizes awarded at the Halton Hills Civic Centre, Thursday, Nov. 3 at 7:30 p.m.. A preview of all submitted entries will commence at 6:30 p.m.

Entry forms are available at various locations around the town, including Halton Camera Exchange, Halton Hills Civic Centre, Georgetown Photo, and both Halton Hills Public Libraries, Acton and Georgetown branches.
