

# Town treasurer says gas prices will impact budget

Continued from pg. 1 because of the price of gas. The company and drivers split the cost of gas.

"I can soak it up," Wood said. "But the drivers are the ones it's hurting."

The high gas prices are also affecting the bottom line at the Town of Halton Hills.

Halton Hills treasurer Ed DeSousa said the town will be over its \$225,000 budget for gas and diesel costs for its public works, parks and fire vehicles. How much over budget will depend on whether gas prices drop or continue to rise.

DeSousa said there was no way of anticipating gas jumping

to \$1.32 a litre. However, the town is getting ready for higher prices next year.

"Right now we're doing our projections for next year and we're anticipating a 20 per cent increase overall from 2005," DeSousa said. "So that's another \$45,000."
