

Open house proceeds donated to the library



William Band to lead watercolour course for local artisans group

Tave you ever wanted to take a trip, or walk in the woods, and just sit down and record your own version of what you se around you? Have you tried, but just weren't happy with the results? Do you need a little help with you drawing or painting techniques?

William Band is a local artist with a world-wid reputation for his watercolour paintings of local and international scope. He will be leading a special watercolour painting course for the Credit Valley Artisans, a non-profit group in Halton Hills.

Band will take you from rough thumbnail sketche (working from a photograph or outdoors) to graduated washes, working dark to light, mountains, drawing skills, introduction to contour, rugged barn with spatter, dry brush texture, rust, landscape, hasty not cards, and much more. Find out what paints and brushes to use, what to paint on, and what equipment you really need. In other words - the basics!

The courses run for four Mondays from noon to p.m. starting on October 3.


This course is designed to teach the beginner the basics of creating a pattern, methods of scoring breaking out, grinding, foiling, and soldering coloured and textured glass. The course also provide an excellent refresher for those stained glass artisan who are out of practice and want to brush up on their skills. Students will be working on a 3-4 piece light catcher and a main project panel of 12-15 pieces.

It will be held on eight, starting Thursdays, Sep 22. The first and last class 7-10 p.m., all other classe 7:30-10 p.m. Cost: \$136 (CVA members \$125). A tools and equipment are provided and supplies are included in the course fee.
