## Allison tosses no-hitter to clinch Peel/Halton title for Squirt Hawks

Tarole Allison left the Mississauga Hurricanes twisting in the wind as the Halton Hills Squirt Hawks claimed the Halton/Peel Fastpitch championship.

Allison tossed a no-hitter and struck out 17 batters as the Hawks blanked Mississauga 8-0. Supplying the offence were Jaime Vieira and Kassidy Veenstra, who went 2-for-3 and Taylor Brown, who was 1for-2 and scored twice.

The Hawks opened the Halton/Peel tournament with a 7-4 victory over the Mississauga Tigers. Maddison Presswood, Cassie Lloyd and Maddie Mayberry were each 2-for-3 and Mayberry pitched a complete game for the victory.

Allison then threw a one-hitter and fanned 11 in a 6-1 win over the Brampton Blazers. Allison also helped herself at the plate by going 2-for-2 and Brittany Brown

was 1-for-2 with an RBI.

The Hawks followed up their league championship with a bronze medal at the Ontario Provincial Grand Championships. Halton Hills split its four games.

Jenn Eady scored twice and Allison went 2-for-2 as the Hawks blanked Napanee 6-0.

Mayberry scored a pair of runs as the Hawks doubled London 6-3. Veenstra tripled and scored in that game.

The Hawks dropped a 4-1 decision to Oakville despite a 2-for-3 performance by Eady.

The Hawks also fell 13-8 to Stratford despite some strong performances at the plate. Lloyd, Vieira, Tearney Johnston Jones, Allison and Mayberry were 2 for 3 and Chantal Prevost and Kendra Hole were 1for-2 with an RBI.

The Hawks finished the season with 37 wins and four ties in 57 games.







