Carole Allison left the Mississauga Hurricanes twisting in the wind as the Halton Hills Squirt Hawks claimed the Halton/Peel Fastpitch championship.

Allison tossed a no-hitter and struck out 17 batters as the Hawks blanked Mississauga 8-0. Supplying the offence were Jaime Vieira and Cassidy Veenstra, who went 2-for-3 and Taylor Brown, who was 1-for-2 and scored twice.

The Hawks opened the Halton/Peel tournament with a 7-4 victory over the Mississauga Tigers. Maddison Presswood, Cassie Lloyd and Maddie Mayberry were each 2-for-3 and Mayberry pitched a complete game for the victory.

Allison then threw a one-hitter and fanned 11 in a 6-1 win over the Brampton Blazers. Allison also helped herself at the plate by going 2-for-2 and Brittany Brown

was 1-for-2 with an RBI.

The Hawks followed up their league championship with a bronze medal at the Ontario Provincial Grand Championships. Halton Hills split its four games.

Jenn Eady scored twice and Allison went 2-for-2 as the Hawks blanked Napanee 6-0.

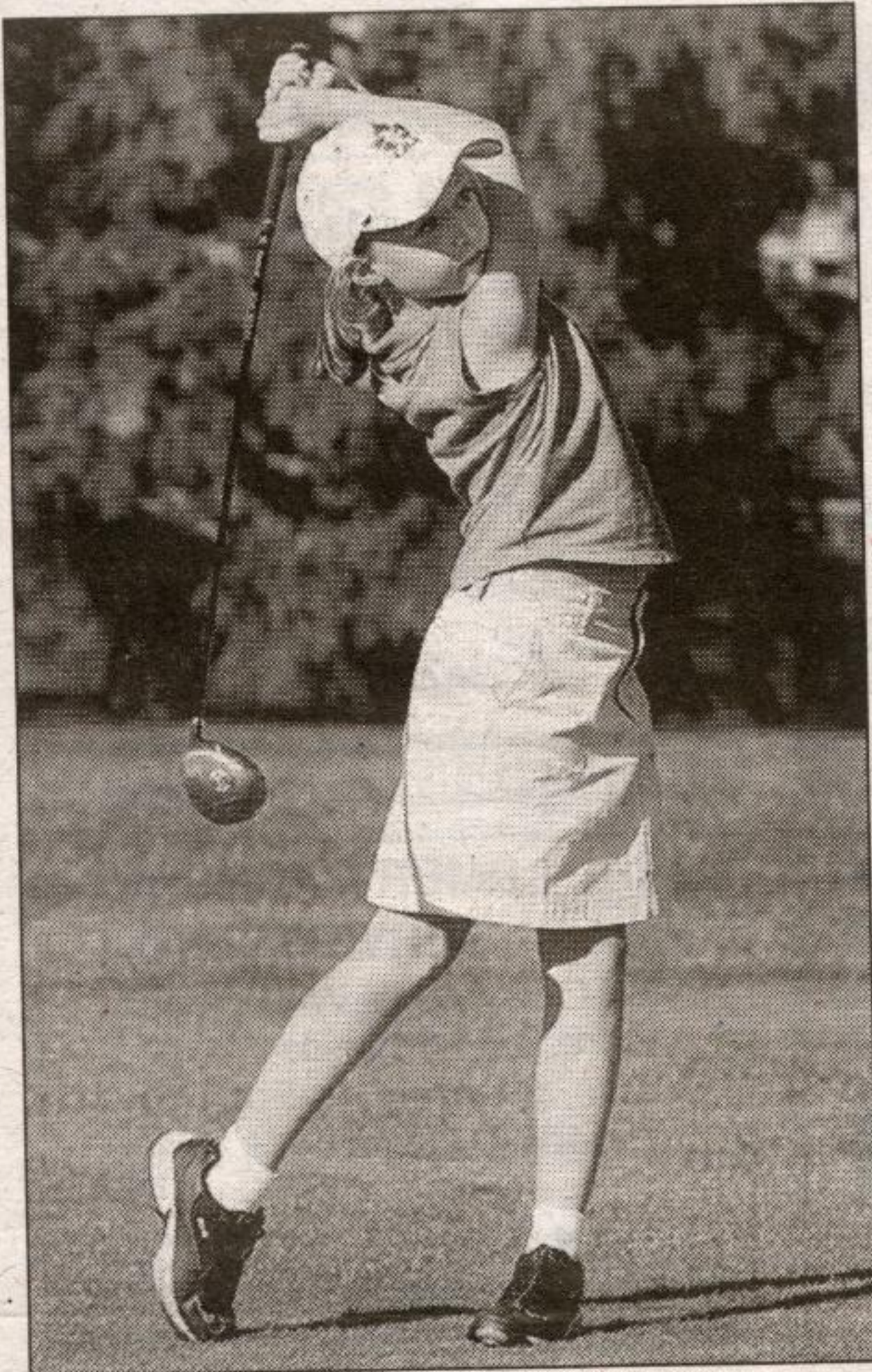
Mayberry scored a pair of runs as the Hawks doubled London 6-3. Veenstra tripled and scored in that game.

The Hawks dropped a 4-1 decision to Oakville despite a 2-for-3 performance by Eady.

The Hawks also fell 13-8 to Stratford despite some strong performances at the plate. Lloyd, Vieira, Tearney Johnston Jones, Allison and Mayberry were 2 for 3 and Chantal Prevost and Kendra Hole were 1-for-2 with an RBI.

The Hawks finished the season with 37 wins and four ties in 57 games.

A clinic last year at North Halton Golf and Country Club gave Samantha Spencer the golfing bug.

And the nine-year-old took what she learned and turned it into a successful first season on the Canadian Junior Golf Association's Junior Linkster Tour.

Spencer wrapped up the season with a third-place finish at the Junior Linkster Tour Championship at the Annandale Golf and Country Club in Ajax. She shot nine-hole rounds of 54 and 51 at the two-day event.

Spencer played in nine CJGA Junior Linkster tournaments this summer. Supplementing her knowledge from the clinic, with some lessons from North Halton associate pro Cory Gentes, she showed major improvement along the way.

From her first tournament where she shot a 76, Spencer continued to lower her scores into the 60s and by summer's end into the low 50s, including a best round of 45.

In a mid-August event at the Humber Valley Golf Club in Toronto she chalked up her first victory with a 50 to win by three strokes. She also earned herself three runner-up finishes along the way.
