Davis suggests walking, cab fare be eligible for expense claims

Councillor says new policy a 'loss for the community'

aying his colleagues are missing an opportunity, Councillor Mike Davis suggested the Town's Personnel Policy manual be changed to allow expense charges for non-motorized methods of transportation.

Two weeks ago, Halton Hills council changed the policy to insert the words "motorized vehicle" after it was discovered Davis was submitting expenses for his bicycle use.

"There is a tremendous loss in this community with this policy. It's a message that other forms of transportation

are not important and are trivialized," said Davis.

The Ward 3 councillor re-argued his case at Monday night's meeting stating his bicycle use has had direct costs such as replacement of bike tires.

He suggested the Corporate Affairs committee examine the issue by reviewing other jurisdictions, and asking the Town's Environmental Advisory Committee and the cycling committee for their opinions. He suggested other forms of

and taxi use.

But Mayor Rick Bonnette ruled Davis must re-submit this as a notice of motion at a future meeting.

"I was quite shocked or aghast at the thought that anybody would think of putting in for mileage for using a bicy-

cle," said Ward 3 Councillor Moya Johnson, who was absent from the meeting two weeks ago. "And the suggestion (by Davis) that even shoes cost money. It's even beyond my comprehension that I would ever charge for shoes if I walked to my place of employment, which this (Civic Centre) is.... We're well paid for this part-time job and the cost of a bike tire once in a while is not something we should be charging the taxpayers for."

Last year, Johnson submitted one of the lowest expense accounts \$45 for expenses, while her ward mate, Davis submitted the highest among council-

lors, \$1,500.
