

Ex-Acton store owner dies in chopper crash

A former associate dealer of Acton Canadian Tire died when his helicopter crashed in a B.C. field Saturday.

Bob Honour, 51, the dealer at the Acton store from 1992-1994, was piloting the Enstrom Helicopter when it crashed Saturday night in a privately-owned field in Duncan, B.C.

RCMP report when officers arrived at approximately 7:30 p.m. they found the wreckage of the helicopter, that had taken off from the Duncan airport, engulfed in flames.

The bodies of Honour and Les Chadwick, 29, both of Cowichan Valley, B.C. were found in the wreckage.

The Transportation Safety Board is investi-

gating the crash.

Honour was the associate dealer of a Canadian Tire store in Duncan B.C., Chadwick was the store's hardware manager.

"He's going to be very missed by his staff at the store and his family as well," said Lisa Gibson of Canadian Tire Corporation.

She said Honour was very passionate about the retail business and his hobbies—including flying his helicopter.

Acton resident Scott Rowsell, 33, worked for Honour at the Acton Canadian Tire store when he was a college student.

"He was a really nice guy to work for," said Rowsell.

Honour is survived by his wife Reta and three children Melissa, Stephanie and Greg.

Metal items and appliances will ONLY be collected on a call-in basis, and therefore will not be collected on your scheduled Bulk Collection day.



Metal items and appliances include refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, stoves, washers, dryers, metal furniture, broken down swing sets, etc.


Please ensure the doors are removed for safety.
