back of the Mustangs in the league standings. But after a slow start, the Mustangs capitalized on a penalty kick and took advantage of two corner kicks to post a convincing win. The victory improved their record to 14-2-1 on the season.

"We knew we had a good chance of winning the division," said Mustang coach Tony Glen. "It's one thing to recognize that you've got a strong group of players, but to go out and live up to those expectations is a lot more difficult."

Needing a win to clinch the title, the Mustangs didn't get the start they were hoping for. Mount Hamilton controlled the first 10 minutes and narrowly missed converting a cross for the game's first goal.

Georgetown slowly took control and midway through the half, Amanda Larade was awarded a penalty kick for a hand ball call against Mount Hamilton. She drilled a kick into the right corner but the goal was called back when two Mustang players moved too early. Given a re-kick, Larade this time went to the left side, scoring just beyond the reach of the Mount Hamilton netminder.

The Mustangs would add to the lead in the final minute of the half. After a couple of attempts were blocked following a corner kick, the ball came to Jaden Todd at the top of the penalty box and she drilled it home for a 2-0 advantage.

Georgetown put the game away in the second half with a similar goal. Larade's corner kick set up one chance that was blocked but the ball went to Nicole Waters who booted a low shot out of the keeper's reach.

The lead did nothing to slow the Mustangs'

pursuit of goals. They had three good scoring chances in less than a minute. Meliss Morgan's good run up the left side set up chance that saw Natasha Green hit the post Green got the ball alone in front moments late but her strike just missed the top corner Larade, Danielle Atienza and Shannon Plan also narrowly missed goals.

Hamilton's scoring chances were limited in the second half but whenever they did have ar opportunity, Mustang keeper Rachelle Greenwood was there to stop them.

The league title assures the Mustangs o returning to the SRSL Elite Division next season. The Mustangs played there last year bu seven ties kept them in the bottom half of the standings and when four teams were relegate ed, the Mustangs were dropped to the Premier Division.

This year they were determined to return They battled for league title all season and turned in impressive tournament results including reaching the final of both the Robbie International Soccer Tournament and the DISC March Break Tournament. However their chances of winning the league were deals a blow in late August when they lost 3-2 to St. Catharines, the last-place team in the division.

"I think it was a rude awakening when we lost to St. Catharines. We started the season quite strongly but in August we didn't have a lot of momentum. Then they lost that game and then they realized that unless they work and concentrate on what they're doing, any team could beat them."

They rebounded from the loss to win the OSCAR tournament in Oakville and won four straight in league play to clinch the title. The Mustangs were also edged in a shootout of the SRSL League Cup final.
