The Georgetown resident and North Halton Golf and Country Club member was named to the Ontario Golf Hall of Fame earlier this week— just the latest in a long, long line of honours for the hard-hitting amateur.

Lapointe, 45, who moved to Georgetown in 1993, has a list of accomplishments that would make most pro golfers blush.

Included in her resumé are 21 Ontario championships (five Ontario Amateur titles, four Ontario Match Play crowns and 12 Ontario Mid-Amateur wins). She's won the Quebec Amateur ladies title six times and ditto for the Eastern Provinces. Four times she was the top Canadian ladies amateur and racked up one Toronto Star Amateur crown.

She's been a fantastic ambassador for our town (competing nationally and internationally) and is undoubtedly its most decorated athlete. In her typical unassuming fashion, she credits her family for playing a significant role in her success.

Perhaps the highlight of Lapointe's golfing career (where does one start?) occurred earlier this year when she became only the sixth Canadian to win a United States golf title when she won the U.S. Ladies Mid-Amateur in Texas.

While this win likely sparked hall of fame officials to leap into action to induct Lapointe, we'd like to remind them her accomplishments before this win should have been enough for induction.

Oh, and as if her opponents needed something more to worry about, consider the fact that Lapointe seems to be improving with age, much like a fine wine.

Just imagine what she'll do on the senior tour in five years.
