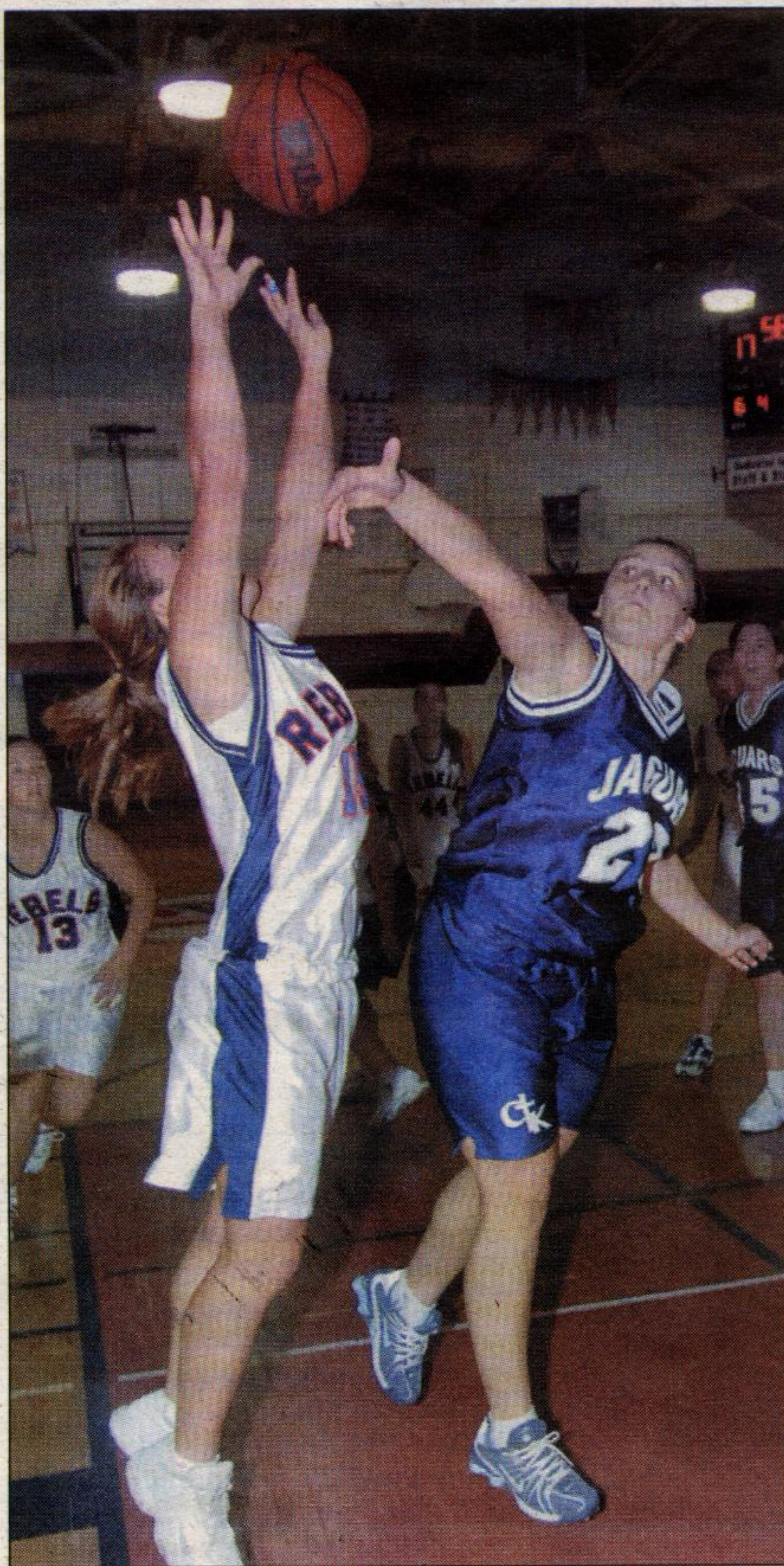

Jaguars claim own tournament crown

Victoria Duffield scored 26 points, leading the Christ the King Jaguars back from a four-point halftime deficit to win 40-34 over Assumption in the final of the Jaguars' junior girls basketball tournament.

Kelly Laidlaw had six points in the final for the Jags, who outscored Assumption 14-3 in the third quarter.

The Jaguars were undefeated in the tournament, going 3-0 in round-robin play. Christ the King defeated Assumption 41-23 earlier in the tournament. Duffield led the way with 14 points.

The Jaguars overcame a 15-12 halftime deficit to down Orangeville's West Side 23-20. Duffield had eight points, Amy Pyne had six, including a three-pointer. Christ the King then defeated King's Christian College 41-21. Kelly Laidlaw and Duffield each had 10 points.

Brittney Moritmer played a strong defensive tournament for the Jaguars while Lauren Facchin contributed to the offence with numerous assists.

The Acton Bearcats senior girls basketball team reached the consolation final of the Brampton Christian School Invitational but fell 23-12 to Mississauga Private.

The Bearcats were edged 22-18 by the tournament hosts in the opening game. Erica Mills led the Bearcats with six points while Nicole Gilbert contributed five.

Despite having just seven players and finishing the game with just six due to an injury, Acton pulled away down the stretch, scoring 12 points in the final quarter to down T.L. Kennedy 30-16. Jenn Balch paced the Bearcat offence with 13 points, Joanie Weaver had seven and Amanda Dennis chipped in with six.

Sam Ralph had six points as the Georgetown Rebels won their third straight game by downing the Christ the King Jaguars 17-12 Monday afternoon.

The Rebels have allowed only eight points per game this season and had held the Jaguars to four points through three quarters until the Jags' Victoria Duffield scored six in the final quarter to finish with a game-high 10 points.

The Rebels completed the sweep with a 31-11 victory over CtK in the senior game. Sherelle Sheppard paced the Rebels by scoring 13 points. Margareta Jostaik was the Jaguars' top scorer with five points.

The win improved the senior Rebels to 2-1 while Christ the King is now 0-1.

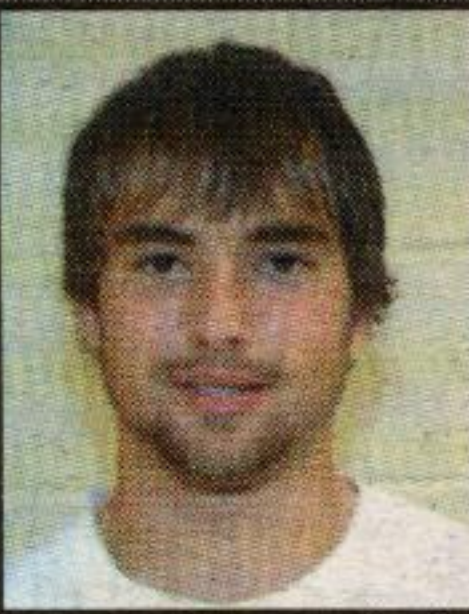

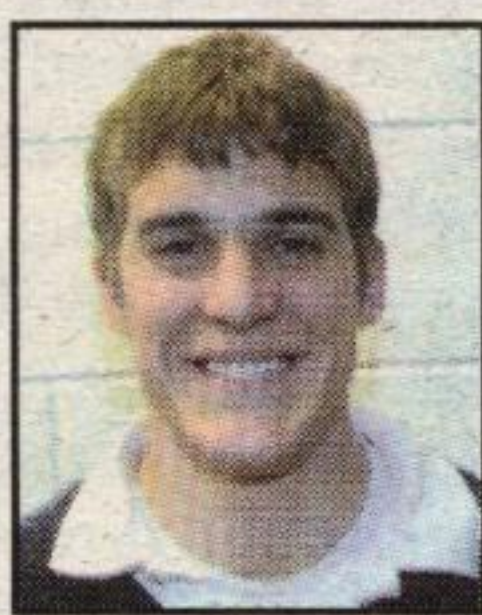
