The Town of Halton Hills measured up in 2004. At least it released its fifth annual report on Performance Measures, as required by the Province.

Here's a sample:

- 8.3 per cent of operating costs went to governance and corporate management
- 54 cents/\$1,000 of assessment is spent for fire services
- \$846.90 is spent on operating costs for paved roads per lane kilometre
- \$3,195.22 is spent for gravel roads per lane kilometre
- 66.7 per cent of paved lane kilometres is rated as good to very good

condition

- The Town met or exceeded snow clearing requirements during "winter events" 100 per cent of the time
- The Town spends \$117.27 per person for operating costs of parks, recreation programs and recreational facilities
- Total participant hours for recreation programs per 1,000 persons is 22,067
- \$36.37 per person was spent on operating library services;
- The number of library uses per person is 26 at a cost of \$1.40 per use
- The percentage of electronic library uses to the total library use was 54 per cent.

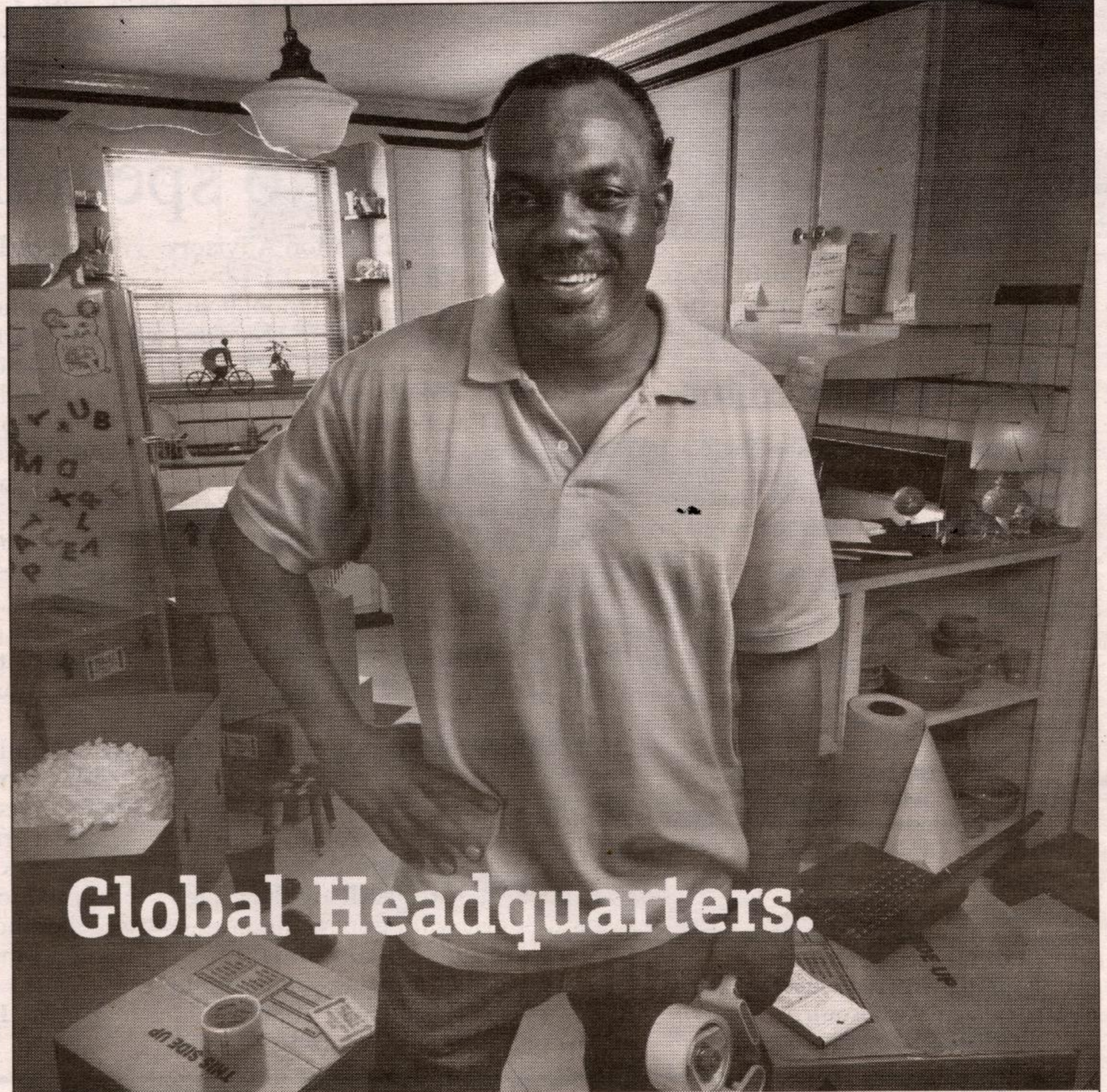
