## Church event to aid rebuilding in Mozambique

When Joseph and Perpetua Alfazema left Mozambique, they thought they would never return. They found in Canada a safe harbour from a 30 years long civil war, but as with all refugees, their hearts were back in Africa. The war finally over, they returned home only to find it devastated in poverty.

Back to Canada, they gathered support from their church and community to rebuild Joseph's home village of Kapasseni. In 1999 they led a group of volunteers in building a school, and since then they have been working to bring Kapasseni back to life.

Immanuel Lutheran Church is bringing the Alfazemas and their story to Georgetown this Sunday, showing the movie, *Journey To Kapasseni: A Refugee's Gift* in the Georgetown Cinemas at 4 p.m. Admission is free, and a free-will offering will be gathered for the Kapasseni Project.

"The Alfazemas are a Canadian dream come true," says Rev. Gerson Flor. "Here they found a place to live, and grow, and hope; now they want to take that back to their homeland. Many people here speak Joseph and Perpetua's language, and many more share their heart; I hope Halton Hills will welcome them and put Kapasseni on our map."

**NOTICE OF A PUBLIC WORKSHOP**

**Draft Protocol for Establishing Telecommunication Towers and Related Facilities**  
 Town of Halton Hills  
 File No. A12/Communication Towers

Town of Halton Hills staff will conduct a public workshop to present the "Draft Protocol for Establishing Telecommunication Towers and Related Facilities", which includes guidelines relating to site-location, design, and public consultation, for proposed telecommunication towers and related facilities throughout the Town of Halton Hills.

In general the protocols offers guidelines pertaining to the following:

- The exemption from a review process for co-locating towers, towers less than 16.8m in height, modifications of existing towers within 10% of the original height, and temporary towers;
- Provide a more expeditious review process for minor proposals including towers within industrial and employment areas and at least 150 metres away from residential uses, and for modifications of existing towers within 10%-25% of the original height; and,
- The requirement of a preliminary consultation meeting with staff, a comprehensive submission package, and a public consultation process through an open house information session for all non-exempt or non-minor proposals.

In addition, the draft protocol provides overall guidelines which will assist Town staff in identifying the appropriateness of proposals during the review process. Guidelines include the encouragement of co-location, landscaping, and the placement of towers away from residential and institutional uses, and lands with natural features.

A presentation will be provided at 7:00 P.M. followed by a question and answer period.
