








Michaelson's work chosen for international art exhibition

The work of Glen Williams ceramic artist, Carol-Ann Michaelson, was selected to exhibit in the Joy of the Noble Teacup, International Chawan Exhibition in Belgium.

She was one of seven Canadian artists to have been selected for the jointly organized event by the Belgium and Japanese governments.

In addition to the exhibition, which opened at the St Bernardus Abbey, in Hemiksem, there will also be a symposium and demonstrations honouring the aesthetic of beauty in simplicity and harmony. The chawan, is an oriental tea bowl used in the formal and traditional Japanese tea ceremony. After the conference, Michaelson's work will tour around the country for four months.
