Next week is Crime Prevention Week in Ontario. This year the theme is "Your Family, Your Community: Keep Them Safe". The Halton Regional Police Service is hosting several seminars across the region that members of the public may find helpful and informative.

In 1 District there will be a presentation on Monday, Nov. 7 at the Milton Police Station at 7 p.m. by a member of the Fraud Unit about identity theft. The presentation is free, but you must book a seat, as space is limited. Call 905-878-5511 ext 5247.

The Georgetown Police Station will be hosting information sessions for children on Tuesday, Nov. 8 at 2 p.m. This session is aimed at pre-school and kindergarten ages. At 6:30 p.m. there will be a session for older school-aged children. Children will learn about the police, safety and the 911 system, and have a tour of the station. Parents must accompany their children, and space is limited so you must reserve a seat by calling 905-878-5511 ext 5247.

Also on Tuesday, Nov. 8 there will be information sessions at the Milton Police Station at 1:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. to assist with installing car seats safely. These sessions are aimed at parents, caregivers and retailers. You must register by calling 1-866-442-5866.
