### Three (3) Temporary Labourers (Public Works) - Posting No. 200545

Under the direction of Public Works supervisory staff, perform Public Works maintenance activities for a limited period of time. Perform maintenance activities on road allowances, infrastructure and drainage systems. Maintain parking lots, equipment, other Town properties, and traffic control devices.

#### General Qualifications:

- Provide labour assistance to other staff to work on all public works activities and follow prescribed methods and established procedures for maintenance of roads, shoulders, gravel surfaces, bridges, culverts, trees, boulevards, ditches, storm sewer systems, concrete sidewalks, interlocking paving stones, concrete curbs, asphalt repairs, spray patching, sweeping, flushing and traffic control devices.
- Operate and maintain a 3 and 5 tonne snow plow truck with a wing person and learn to operate computerized material spreading devices. Operate a 4x4 pick-up truck with a snowplow and tractors with attachments, including plow and sander to safely and efficiently clear snow from cul-de-sacs, cemeteries, sidewalks and parking lots completing all winter control activities to Town standards.
- Operate and maintain the flusher, tandem trucks, steam generator and surface preparation machine.
- Follow prescribed program routes, complete written reports on works completed and note site conditions.
- Competently perform all flag person activities in accordance with traffic safety regulations.
- Operate hand and power tools in a safe and productive manner to complete maintenance activities.
- Perform janitorial duties, clean and maintain vehicles, check fluid levels and complete circle checks.
- Work safely with regard to the regulations as outlined in the Occupational Health and Safety Act.

For lands located on the north side of Regional Road 10 Part of Lot 11, Concession 9 Town of Halton Hills (Esquensing)

### Town of Halton Hills Files D12/14/FERNBROOK HOMES - MOUNTAINVIEW "CHESTER PARCEL" (24T-05002/H)

The Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss proposed amendment applications to the Town of Halton Hills Zoning By-law 74-51 as amended, in conjunction with a plan of subdivision. The application relates to a property municipally known as Part of Lot 11, Concession 9, Town of Halton Hills (Esquensing). The 1.62ha (4 acre) subject property is located on the north side of Regional Road 10, east of Main Street.

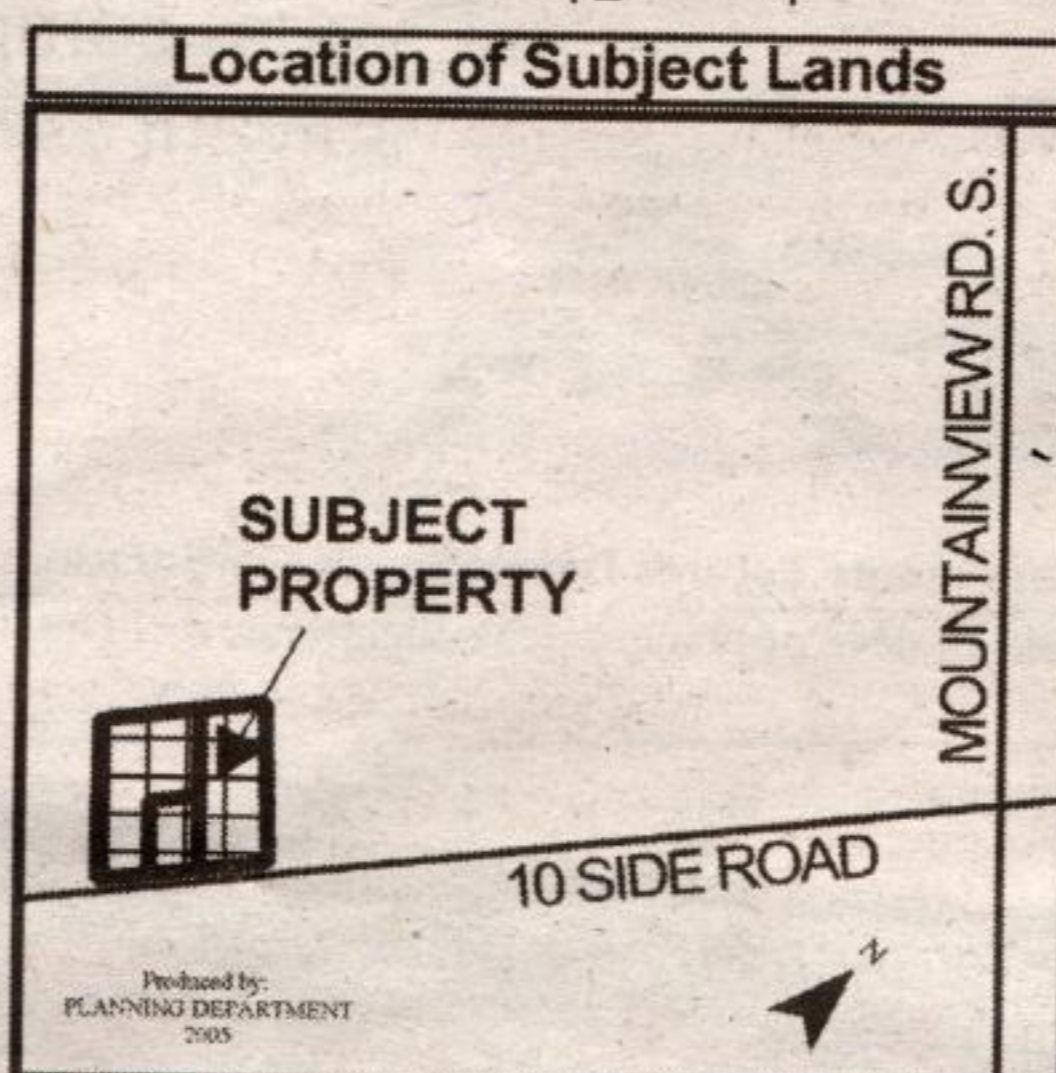
The proposed Zoning By-law Amendment would rezone the lands from a Rural (RU) Zone to a split Fifth Density Residential Special (R5-2) Zone/Sixth Density Residential Special (R6-1). The subdivision application, processed under File 24T-05002, proposes the creation of 26 single detached residential lots, and a completion of the road network.

Below is a map showing the location of the subject property to which the proposed Zoning By-law amendment would apply.

If a person or public body that files a notice of appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment and/or Plan of Subdivision does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is adopted and the subdivision is Draft Approved, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

### Regarding A Proposed Temporary Use By-law (Zoning By-law Amendment) For lands located at Part of Lot 27, Concession 4 RP 20R-9833, Part 1, and 9646 Highway 7, 24T-91008/H Town of Halton Hills (Esquensing)

Town of Halton Hills File: D14/Acton Golf Centre Limited

General Committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss the proposed Temporary Use By-law application to amend the Town of Halton Hills Zoning By-law 74-51 as amended. The proposed Temporary Use By-law applies to the properties municipally known as Part of Lot 27, Concession 4, RP 20R-9833, Part 1 and 9646 Highway 7, Draft Approved Subdivision File 24T-91008/H, Town of Halton Hills (Esquensing). The subject properties are approximately 40.4 hectares (99.8 acres) in size, and are located at the south west corner of the intersection of Highway 7 and the Fourth Line. The properties are partially located within the Rural Cluster of Bannockburn.

Below is a map showing the location of the subject properties to which the proposed Temporary Use By-law (Zoning By-law Amendment) would apply.

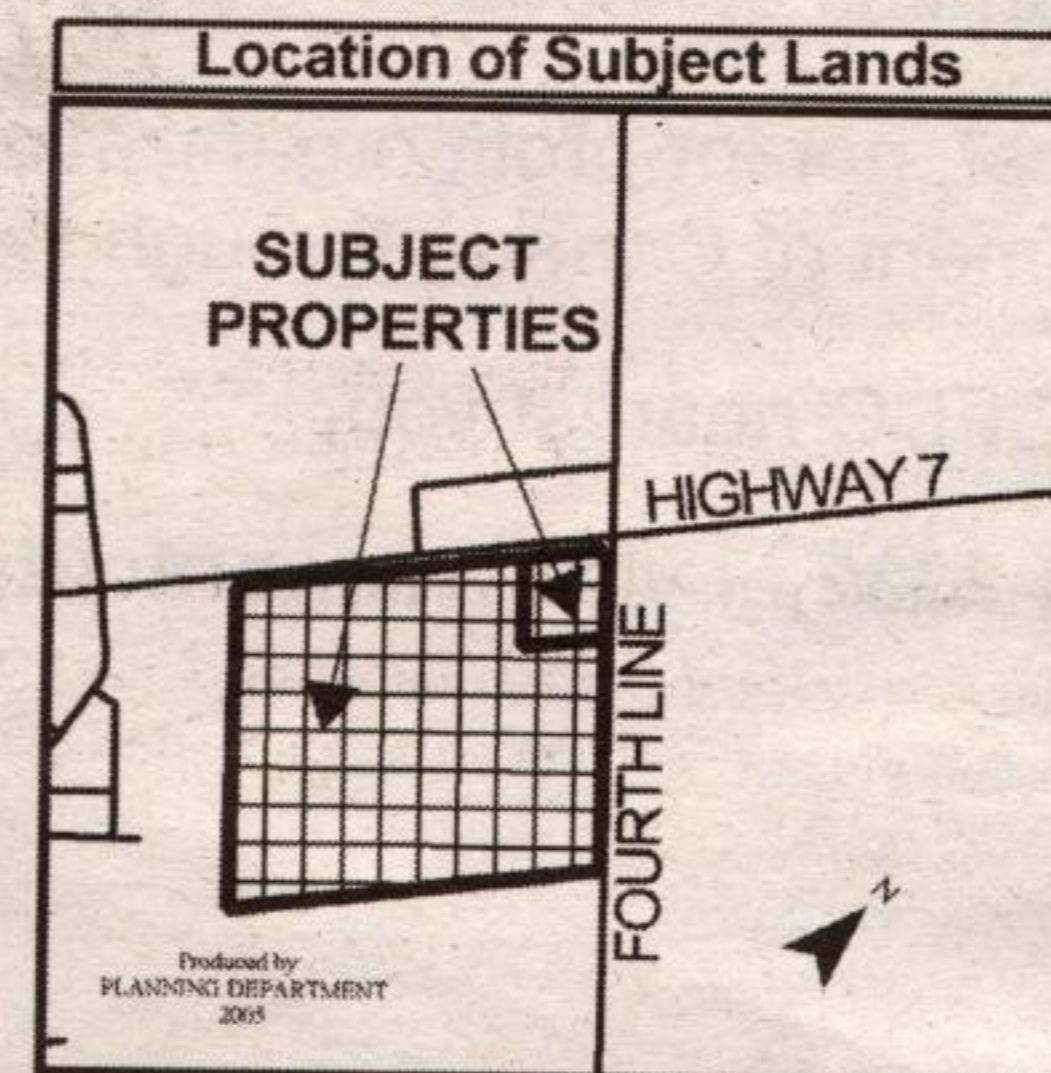
The subject properties are currently zoned to permit a "golf driving range, a parking lot, a putting green, a chipping area and a 49 sq. m. building" by Temporary Use By-law 2003-0048 which is set to expire on April 4, 2006. The properties are also zoned (Zoning By-law 74-51 as amended) and designated (Town of Halton Hills Official Plan) to permit commercial, residential and rural uses. A draft plan of subdivision (24T-91008/H) for 13 residential estate lots has been approved on a portion of the subject properties. A portion of the properties are also located within the Niagara Escarpment Development Control Area.

The purpose and effect of the proposed amendment application is to extend the temporary use of the properties as a golf driving range centre for a further three (3) years and to add a golf mini put as an additional temporary permitted use.
