





Help available in 150 languages through Access Halton service

Those who contact Halton Region can now receive assistance over the phone in more than 150 lan-

guages.

This means that callers who need assistance in a language other than English will have access to telephone translators, usually within seconds.

The new service is provided through Language Line Services, which has more than 2,000 translators across 14 time zones around the world.

During regular business hours, Access Halton's customer service representatives will be able to instantly connect to a telephone translator to communicate with callers who don't speak English.

Access Halton operates the Region's Government Access Centre where staff members provide customers with seamless, single-window access to regional, provincial and federal government information.
