## OPP believe dead woman discovered in Rockwood likely from Quebec

Ontario Provincial Police believe the woman whose body was found near Rockwood in August is likely from Quebec.

Police determined the woman is likely from that province because the clothing she was wearing when she was discovered in a wooded picnic area on Hwy 7 west of Rockwood Sunday, August 28, were only sold in that province.

OPP, with the assistance of the Surete du Quebec, are appealing to residents of that province for help in identifying the woman.

Quebec police agencies are also comparing the OPP information to their missing persons files to determine whether there is a match.

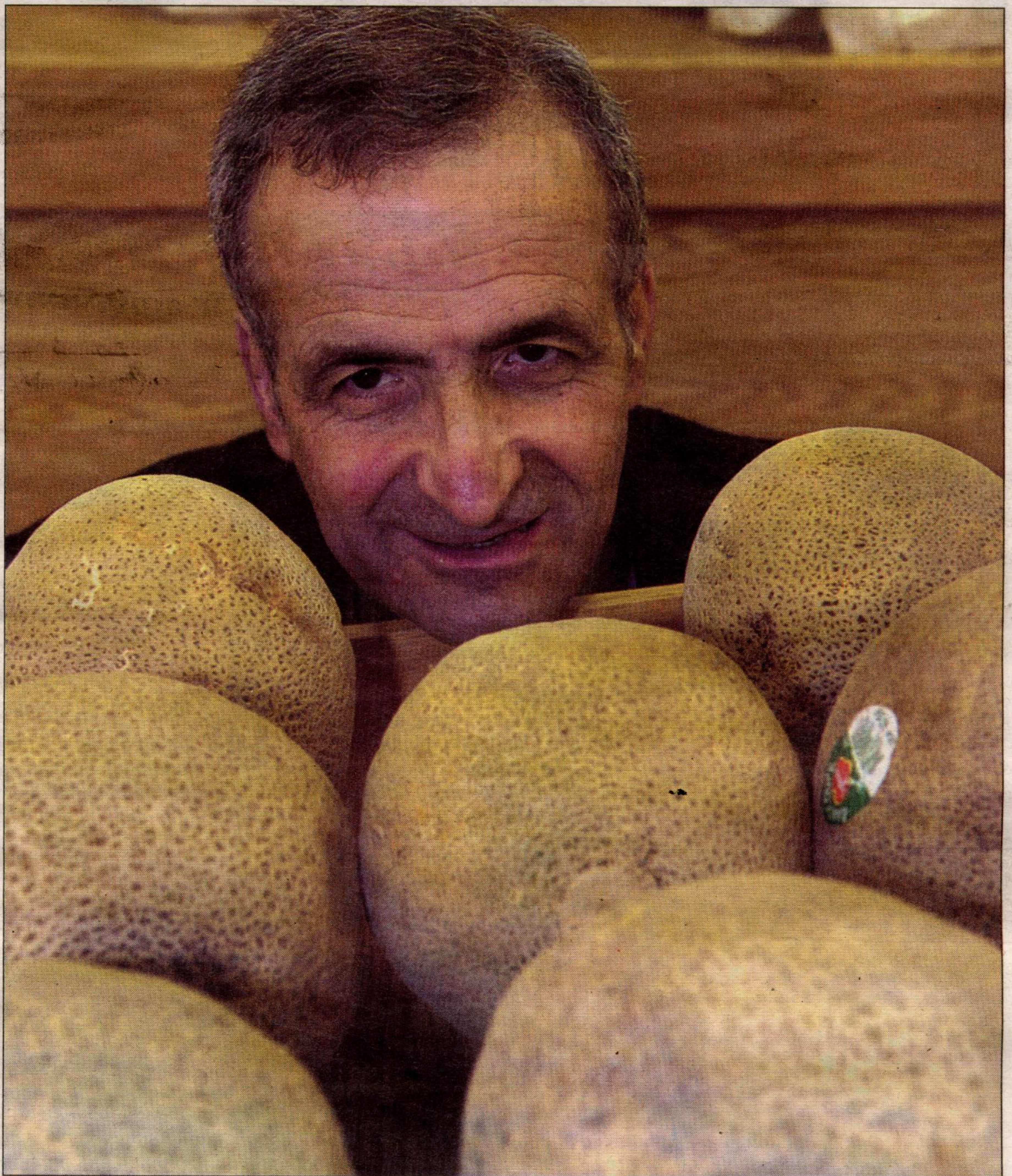
Forensic examination has confirmed that the woman is white, 35 to 45 years old with brown hair. She is approximately 5'4" to 5'6", 130 lbs.

She had a partial upper dental plate and previous fracture to her left cheek.

She was wearing a pink bra label "725 Originals" with the number "31" printed on the left cup; "Rivage Intimate" thong-style panties with a small bow on the waist; an "Atmosphere" size 10-12 round-neck tank-top t-shirt with one-inch straps, "Illegal Jeanswear" size 9 corduroy shorts with two horizontal zippered front pockets and two back pockets with button-down flaps.
