## Devereaux auction nets \$20,000

The preservation of Devereaux House is \$20,000 closer L to reality following an auction and dinner in Acton Saturday.

Approximately 225 people attended the event at Acton Legion, hosted by the Friends of Devereaux House, a local group attempting to raise \$250,000 to preserve the house located on Trafalgar Rd. and owned by the Town of Halton Hills.

Nearly 400 donations of antique furniture, paintings, jewelry, gift certificates and new items came in for the auction chaired by Barb Skinner and Carol Lawson. So many items were received the group set out a silent auction, live auction and several raffles.

She said the committee members spent weeks sorting, cataloguing and evaluating all the items that were donated.

"People got some great items, and many were real bargains, and at the same time, the fund for the house is now growing," said Skinner.
