The show did not run smoothly, with set and scene changes a bit jerky— something that will improve as the production matures.

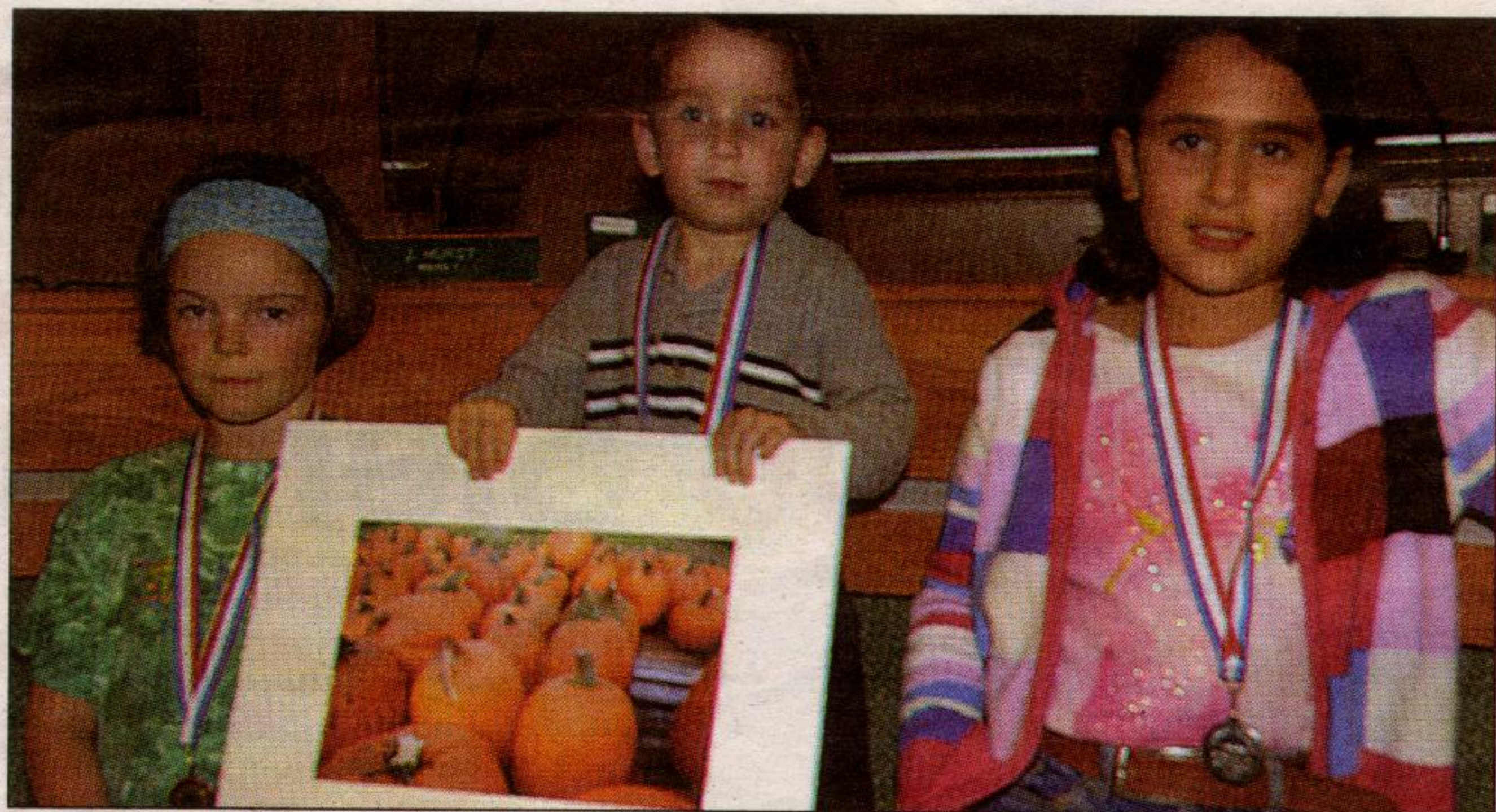
But it goes beyond the actual production— the material may well be better suited to a play, rather than a musical.

And at more than three hours in length, it makes for a long night.

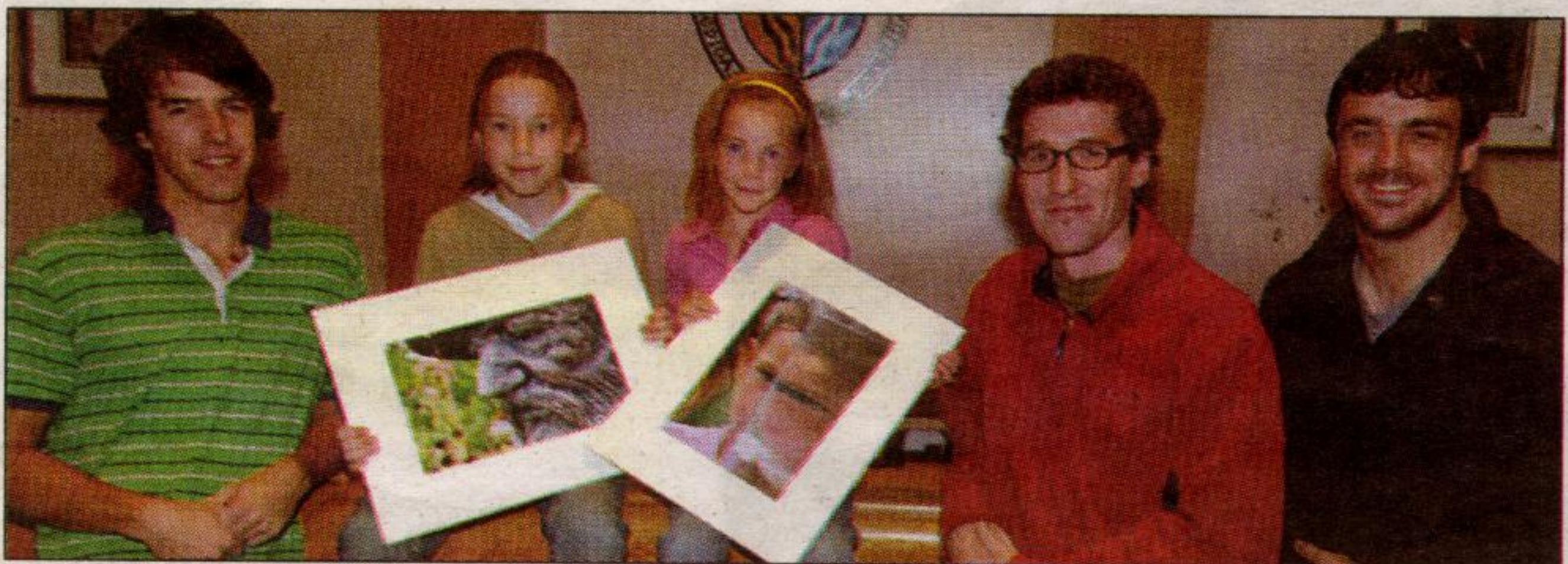
On the other hand however, the show does entertain, and anyone who attends will undoubtedly respond to the one-liners and ambiguous comments that gave the original movie version its child-like charm.
