Raiders cut down Blades 2-1

The Georgetown Raiders discovered a not-so-secret cure Wednesday night for what has been ailing them of late—hard work.

The Raiders, who suddenly found themselves in a six-team dog-fight for playoff positioning in the Provincial Jr. A Hockey League's West Conference after losing four straight games, edged the Oakville Blades 2-1 at Alcott Arena in a match that had the feel of a playoff contest.

"We can't afford to give away any points," said Raider forward Rob Sgarbossa, who netted the winning goal on a power play with 5:14 left in the third period. "There's two points separating second from eighth (actually six separating third from eighth now) so we've got to come to play every night."

Sgarbossa netted the winning marker while Oakville's Julian Cimadore was serving a hooking penalty— one of nine power plays the Blades afforded the Raiders.

"(Mike) Gurtler tried to centre it and it hit me and went in," said Sgarbossa of the winning tally.

Both Raider netminder Ryan Gibb and Oakville's David Scamurra turned in solid games as the Raiders held a 28-27 edge in shots on goal. Both puckstoppers pulled off big saves in the third frame on former teammates as Gibb slid across the net to rob Kyle Frieday while Scamurra stopped former Blade Austin Corredato on a breakaway.

Oakville opened the scoring in the first frame before Corredato connected at the 19:25 mark of the first to tie the game on passes from Gurtler and Sgarbossa. Corredato also got an assist on Sgarbossa's winner. Sgarbossa was pleased to see his club put in a 60-minute effort.

"Finally. We played hard. That was a big game for us," he said.

The win moved the Raiders into sole possession of third place with 30 points. Burlington trails Georgetown by two points but hold four games in hand while the Blades sit three back of the Raiders with two games in hand.
