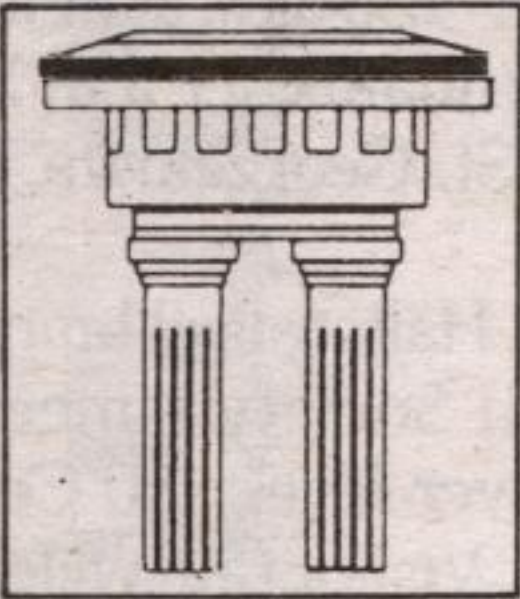

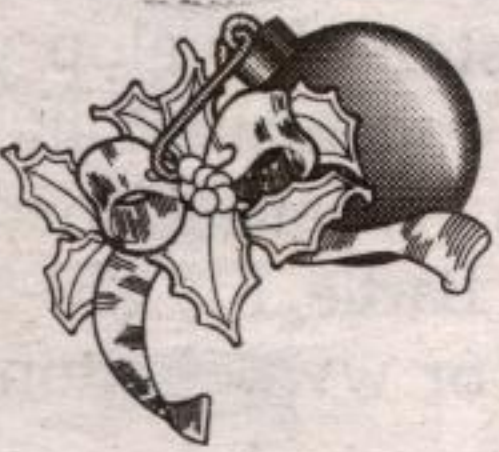

PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE

ROAD RECONSTRUCTION AND WIDENING OF DUNDAS STREET (REGIONAL ROAD 5) FROM NEYAGAWA BOULEVARD (REGIONAL ROAD 4) TO PROUDFOOT TRAIL AND NEW SIXTEEN MILE CREEK STRUCTURES IN THE TOWN OF OAKVILLE

The Region of Halton will be reconstructing and widening Dundas Street (Regional Road 5) from Neyagawa Boulevard (Regional Road 4) to Proudfoot Trail from a 4-lane rural road to a 6-lane urban road. Included in the works are new twin 3-lane structures over 16 Mile Creek, new intersections at Lions Valley Park Road and Fourth Line and the installation of a 1200 mm diameter watermain and twin 600 mm diameter sanitary forcemains.

A Public Information Centre will be held to provide you with an opportunity to review the project drawings and to discuss any potential construction disruptions resulting from the proposed works. Representatives from both Halton Region and our consultants, McCormick Rankin Corporation, will be in attendance to answer any questions. The Public Information Centre is scheduled for:
