Three teenagers charged after laundromat vandalized

Three Georgetown youths are facing charges in connection with the theft of a small quantity of money from a laundry soap supply machine at a Main St. N., Georgetown laundromat early Thursday.

Police say three youths shut off a surveillance camera at the laundromat shortly after midnight, pried open the machine and removed the money.

Police were called by a citizen. When police arrived they found three youths still in the laundromat.

Charged with one count each of a theft under \$5,000 and mischief under \$5,000 are three 14-year-old males.

Region offers Smart Commute

Local residents searching for someone to carpool with can now cruise the Internet to find who they're looking for.

The Region has joined in on the Smart Commute initiative— an on-line ride matching service that connects Halton residents who want to carpool.

Smart Commute's Web site, www.smartcommute.ca, works like a searchable database of classified ads. Commuters create a login and fill out information about their commute, such as time, origin and destination.

Then, the system automatically searches the database to find the

closest possible match. Commuters can also add various preferences to help them find a carpool that best matches his or her needs. Preferences could include whether they can drive or not, will or won't travel with smokers and if they would only like to ride with others of the same gender.

The \$7.9 million Smart Commute initiative— funded by Transport Canada's Urban Transportation Showcase Program, GTA municipalities and the private sector— partners Halton Region with other municipalities, such as the regions of Peel, York, Durham and the cities of Toronto, Mississauga and Hamilton.

SECOND HAND SMOKE INCREASES EAR INFECTIONS IN CHILDREN

Ear infections are the Number One reason young children visit their doctors and take antibiotics. A new study finds many of those infections could be avoided if parents who smoke would make one important change.

A recent study in the archives of pediatric and adolescent medicine is giving parents another reason to quit. It finds exposure to cigarette smoke in the home increases children's risk of middle ear infections. The smoke inflames the tissues of the middle ear so that viruses and bacteria can invade more easily and cause infection.
