

Racial heritage to be examined at CFUW meeting

The next meeting of the University Women's Club of Georgetown will be on Tuesday (Feb. 7) at 7:30 p.m. in the Gallery of the Cultural Centre.

Guest speaker is local author, Dr. Catherine Slaney who embarked on a personal quest to seek some answers to the mysterious history that apparently haunted her mother's family tree. At first it was simply an informal attempt to unearth some lost and forgotten fami-

ly documents and photos but some startling discoveries impelled her to dig a little deeper.

Family Secrets: Crossing the Colour Line traces her personal journey of discovery as the cloak of secrecy receded to reveal a previously unknown side of the family that had been separated by a racial divide for half a century.

Today the black and white cousins joyfully share their common ancestry

and extraordinary interracial history and welcome every opportunity to dispel the myth of race that transcends our society.

Dr. Slaney's personal investigation led her to pursue a doctorate degree in Sociology and Equity Studies in Education and the study of the process of racialization in Canada and the U.S.

User Fees are Changing at the Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS).

Halton Region will be changing the current user fees at the HWMS to keep up with increasing operating costs and to continue providing quality customer service as the Region grows.

Effective Monday, February 6, 2006, the new fee schedule will be:

New Fee Schedule

LOAD	RATE
0-50 kg Same (approximately 8 bags of household garbage)	\$5.00/load
51-150 kg New	\$10.00/load
Greater than 150 kg New	9.8 cents/kg from 0 kg (Tipping fee of \$98.00/tonne does not change)


Did you know?

50 kg is about eight garbage bags of household garbage or a small car trunk load of material. The new fees should not impact small loads coming to the HWMS.

Thanks to the efforts of Halton residents, Halton Region has one of the highest diversion rates in the GTA, with almost 42 per cent of all residential waste being diverted away from our landfill. The updated user fee at the HWMS continues to support the diversion of garbage from the landfill, increasing the lifespan of the landfill for the use of Halton residents.

Halton Participates in Building a Smoke-Free Ontario

National Non-Smoking Week is over, but Halton residents still have the opportunity to quit smoking. The Halton Region Health Department operates Stop Smoking Clinics throughout the community.

Halton's Stop Smoking Clinics offer free counselling by a physician, nurse or trained professional to help you quit smoking for good. Tobacco use causes approximately 350 deaths per year in Halton, with second-hand smoke responsible for 20 of these deaths.
