Busing for Ctk students remains

Following the expectation of local trustee, Irene McCauley, Halton District Catholic School Board trustees took no action at Tuesday's board meeting on a previously tabled motion regarding Christ the King School busing for Georgetown South students.

In February, McCauley tabled a motion to review the busing for these students as an exception to the board's transportation policy, until a legal opinion was obtained on a 2002 motion that provides the bus-

Tuesday's action— or lack of it— means that busing will continue for Georgetown South students, and will not be considered again when annual reviews of the transportation policy exceptions are done.

Town council calls on province to increase funding for libraries

At Councillor Bob Inglis's urging, Halton Hills council sent a letter off to the provincial government requesting an increase in grants to Ontario libraries.

Inglis, the council's representative on the library board, noted that provincial grants have stagnated, with no hikes since 1999, despite

growth in population and operating costs.

Between 1992 and 1999, the Province reduced by 34 per cent its grant to the Halton Hills Public Library from \$102,000 to \$67,000. Today, calculations are based on a 1998 rate of \$4.08 per household.

"We're eight years behind here," said Inglis, adding the resolution is asking the Province to base that grant on an indexed updated model.

SAFETY RECALL OF MOTOMASTER HOTWASH WINDSHIELD WASHER FLUID HEATER

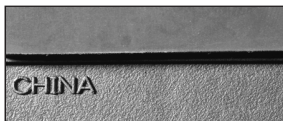

While there have been no reported incidents causing injury, Canadian Tire is asking customers to discontinue the use of this product immediately and to call 1-866-670-9962 to find out if their unit is included in this recall, and to receive a free replacement unit. Customers may also return the product to their local Canadian Tire store for an exchange or full refund.

How the unit can be identified:

This recall affects a small number of units that can be identified by looking at the outer casing of the product for an identifying mark. If the product contains the words 'patent pending' they are not defective and are not included in this recall. If the wording **does not** appear on the back of the product, then these products **may** be defective and customers should call 1-866-670-9962 to determine if they are included in the recall.
