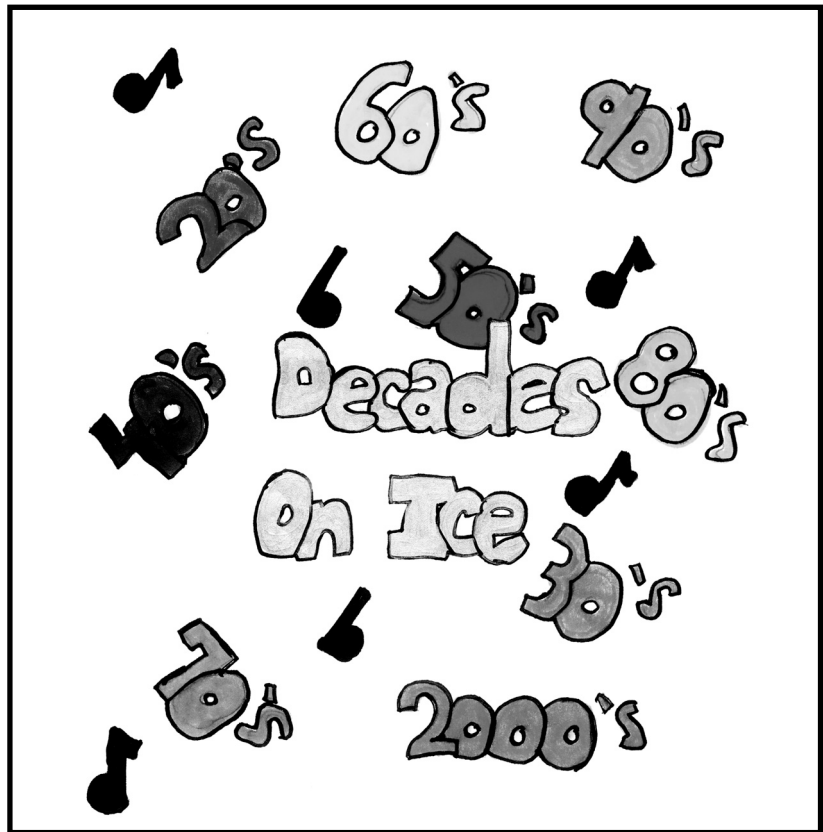

The winner of the series qualifies for the Ontario Hockey Federation Tournament of Champions at Timmins in April.

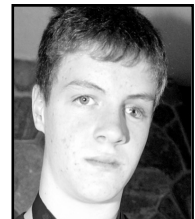

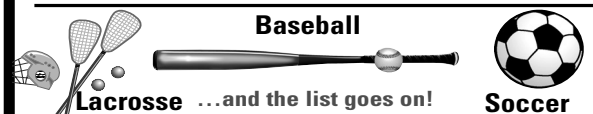
