A major honour was bestowed upon Reverend Peter Joseph Hundt of Holy Cross Church this week when he was ordained Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Toronto.

Approximately 40 area residents attended the meeting at GDHS on the second version of the board's draft capital plan, which is tentatively scheduled to be adopted by the board by June.

At the meeting, Gerry Cullen, the board's superintendent of facilities services, told the residents that the board is faced with a dilemma over a new school location in Georgetown South.

The board currently has two sites in that community, one on the east side of Mountainview Rd. and the other on the west.

The board's preference is to have a new school on the east side of Mountainview Rd. behind Maple Creek Park but there is no servicing available at the school site yet, and
