Tires that cannot be accepted include commercial vehicle, truck and tractor tires. All tires collected will be recycled.

Metal & Appliance Call-in Collection Service



Metal items and appliances will **ONLY** be collected on a call-in basis, and therefore will not be collected on your scheduled Bulk Collection day.

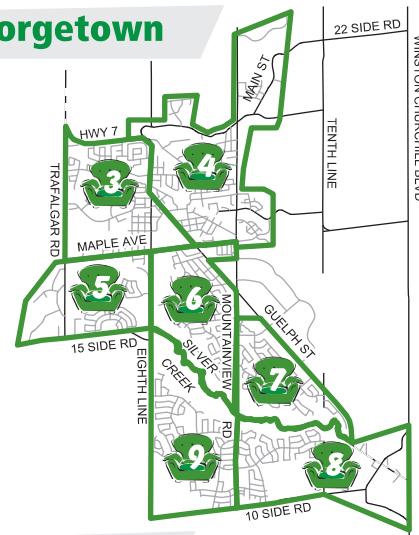
To receive collection, please call Halton Region Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at 905-825-6000.

Metal items and appliances include refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, stoves, washers, dryers, metal furniture, broken down swing sets, etc.

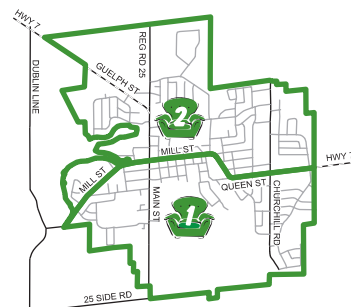
Please ensure the doors are removed for safety.

These items may be disposed of at Halton's Waste Management Site (HWMS), 5400 Regional Road 25, Milton.

*Only small non-hazardous automobile parts can be accepted at the HWMS.

**Only small tree stumps under 30 cm (1 ft) in diameter can be accepted at the HWMS.

Help keep natural corks out of Halton's Landfill through the Bag-a-Cork program

The Halton Waste Management Site (HWMS), in partnership with Girl Guides of Ontario is welcoming natural wine and champagne corks. Natural cork is a recyclable resource that can be reused in different products. An estimated 100 million corks were discarded into Ontario landfills alone in 2005.

To participate in the Bag-a-Cork Program, Halton residents simply save corks accumulated from finished wine or champagne bottles then bring the corks to the HWMS container station or one of the thirteen designated drop-off sites in Halton.
