## Habitat for Humanity accepting applications for Georgetown homes

Habitat for Humanity Halton (HfHH) is accepting applications from low-income working families for three houses which will be built in Georgetown in 2007.

Interested families whose income is below the poverty line, but have a steady income and positive work history, are asked to attend an information session to learn about how Habitat selects partner families. Families that attend will be provided application forms at the end of each session.

The selected families will partner with Habitat to help build the house. Families will purchase the house from Habitat after completing 500 hours of sweat equity, and repay a long-term, zero interest mortgage.

Families can attend one of the following three sessions:

- Tuesday, May 2— 7 p.m. Georgetown Police Station, Community Room, 217 Guelph Street, Georgetown
- Tuesday, May 9— 7 p.m. Real Canadian Superstore, 171 Guelph Street, Georgetown
- Saturday, May 13— 10 a.m. Glen Williams Town Hall, 1 Prince Street, Glen Williams.

Habitat non-profit affiliates across Canada, works in partnership with businesses, churches and community people from all walks of life, to serve those in need of decent, affordable housing by building or renovating houses so that families in our community can break free of the poverty cycle for generations to come.

Habitat for Humanity Halton is an independent, not-for-profit housing organization dedicated to the elimination of poverty housing by building simple, decent, affordable homes in partnership with low income, working families. Habitat builds, renovates and sells houses to low-income families on a no-profit, no-interest basis and provides an interest-free mortgage to families who would otherwise not be able to purchase their own home.

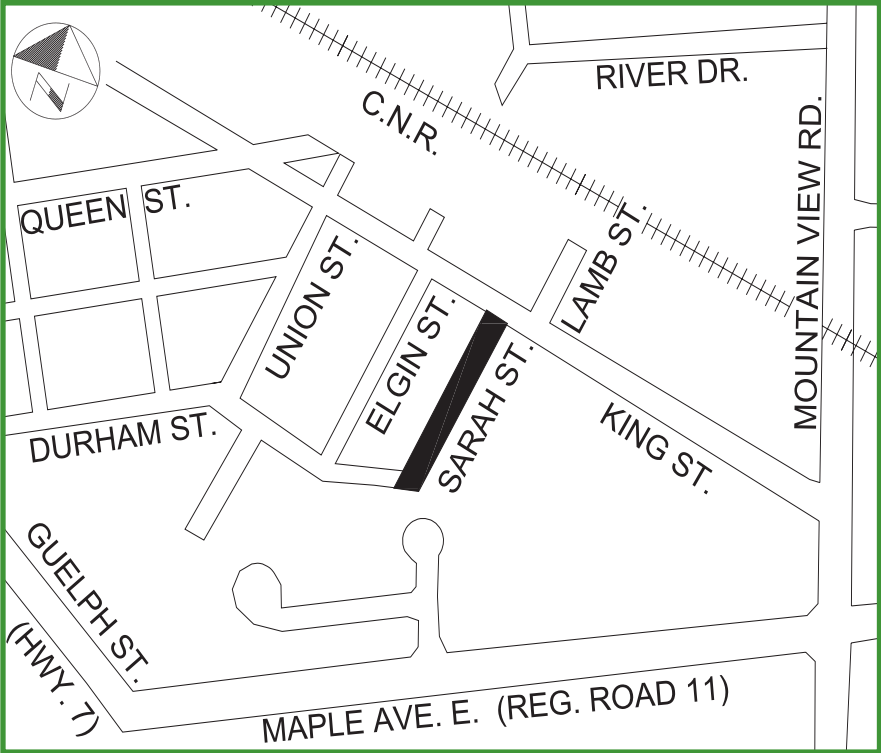
