HALTON HILLS GENERATING STATION

TransCanada Energy Ltd., a wholly owned subsidiary of TransCanada Corporation has commenced planning for a new energy generation facility - the Halton Hills Generating Station - in the 401 industrial corridor in the Town of Halton Hills on a site located between Highway 401 and Steeles Avenue west of 6th Line on undeveloped, industrial lands in the Town of Halton Hills.

This project is being developed in response to the Ontario Power Authority's planned procurement for new generation in the Greater Toronto Area West of Toronto - Request for Proposals No.: GTA-Trafalgar-RFP-2006 Issued: April 28, 2006.

TransCanada will be submitting a proposal to develop a 680 mega-watt natural gas fuelled, combined cycle power plant. If the Ontario Power Authority selects this proposal, and the project achieves all approvals the project will be constructed.

The proposed project will use state-of-the-art low emission, high efficiency technology.

The Halton Hills Generating Station is subject to the Environmental Screening Process for electricity projects as outlined in the Ontario Ministry of the Environment's "Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Electricity Projects." (March 2001)

This notice has been issued to advise the public, other stakeholders and government agencies of TransCanada's proposal and the commencement of the Environmental Screening Process.

TransCanada is committed to engaging and consulting with the public and other stakeholder groups throughout the development of the project. The consultation and engagement process will seek community input regarding local environmental and socio-economic conditions, facility design plans, anticipated project benefits and impacts and impact management plans.

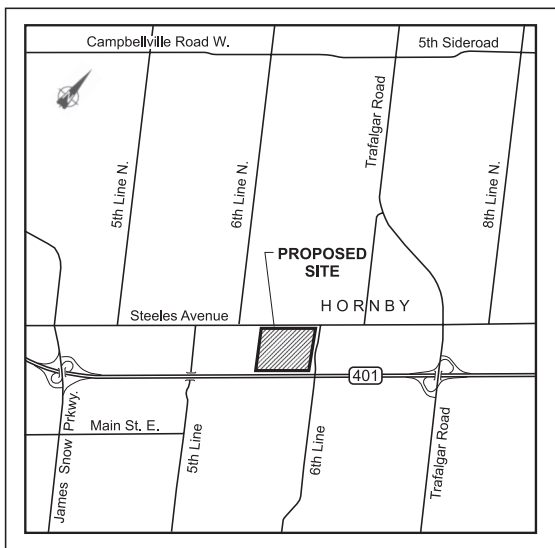
