Halton Region is holding an Environment Day in Halton Hills, to provide residents with the following services:

Free of Charge Drop Off of:



Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

- Acceptable materials include antifreeze, car batteries, cleaners, fluorescent tubes, fuels, household batteries, paint, pesticides, motor oil, pharmaceuticals, pool chemicals, propane tanks, stains, and varsol.
- Unacceptable materials include needles/syringes, asbestos, commercial and industrial waste, PCB's, explosives and ammunition.
- The Partners for Naturally Green will give out lawn and garden prizes (while quantities last) to those turning in old or unused pesticides, or other household hazardous waste.



Tires

- Halton residents may drop off up to eight residential passenger vehicle tires (rims included). Commercial vehicle, truck and tractor tires **will not be accepted**.



Electronics

- Acceptable items include computers, stereos, phones, VCRs, and computer monitors. Television sets and appliances **will not be accepted**.



Reusable Items

- The Salvation Army will be accepting reusable items fit for resale such as clothing, linens, paired shoes, kitchenware, toys, small appliances and undamaged furniture.

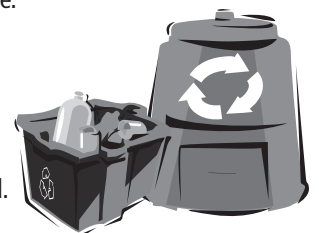
Available to Halton Residents

Blue Boxes (FREE of charge)

Blue Boxes will be available, one free of charge per household, while quantities last. Proof of residency required.

Composters

Earth Machine Backyard Composters can be purchased for \$15 (taxes included). Proof of residency required.



If you are unable to attend the event, a permanent free of charge HHW depot is located at the Halton Waste Management Site at 5400 Regional Rd. 25 in Milton. Tires and electronics are also accepted at the site for a charge. Reusable items are accepted free of charge.

Help Halton Conserve Water

As temperatures increase for the summer, so too does the use of water. There are a number of things we can do everyday to conserve water and ensure there is an adequate water supply to meet essential uses and for fire protection.

Lawns only need 2.5 cm (1") of water a week to stay healthy. To ensure that you are not overwatering consider using a SmartTimer with your sprinkler, or use a rain gauge to measure the amount of water your lawn receives each week.
