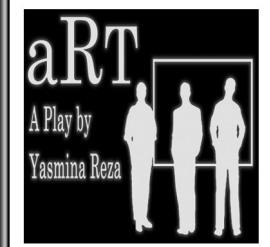

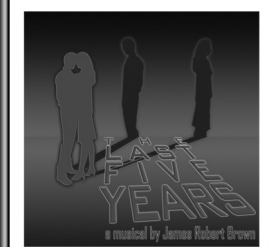

Residents asked to cut back on water use

Halton residents are being urged to curb their water use during this dry-weather stretch.

In an effort to alleviate pressure on its reservoirs, the Region is requesting that residents minimize outdoor water use, including lawn watering and car washing. Flower and vegetable gardens should be watered by hand, and only as needed.

Should the hot, dry weather continue, it may be necessary for the Region to issue a complete watering ban.

Halton has an odd-even day watering bylaw in effect, which advises that even-numbered houses should water only on even calendar days and odd-numbered houses should water only on odd calendar days. However, since lawns only need one inch of water once a week to stay healthy, it's not necessary to water on ever odd or even day.
