The event coincides with the Jerry Lewis MD telethon this weekend and September is also Muscular Dystrophy Awareness month.

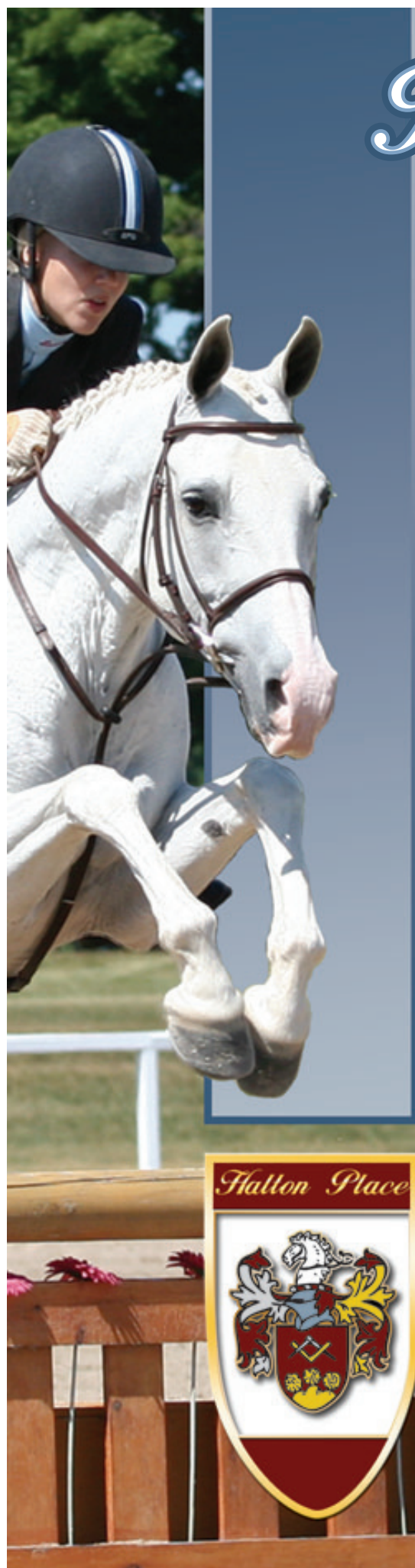
